Compared to last week: Not enough comparable sales on feeder steers or heifers for a market trend. Demand light to moderate. According to the US Drought Monitor, worsening dry conditions prompted expansion of drought and abnormal dryness conditions to the D3 category which expanded in western New Mexico. USDA statistics showed increases in the percentage topsoil moisture short or very short— up to 89% in New Mexico. Supply included: 100% Feeder Cattle (100% Steers). Feeder cattle supply over 600 lbs was 89%. Unless otherwise noted, Feeder Cattle prices FOB based on net weights after a 2-3% shrink or equivalent, with a 4-8 cent slide > 600 lbs. and 8-10 cent slide < 600 lbs. Livestock reported this week originated from NM.
