COLONY, HONEY PLANT AND MARKET CONDITIONS DURING DECEMBER 2020

APPALACHIAN DISTRICT (MD, PA, VA, WV): In early-mid December, the weather was warmer than normal and warm enough to surprise Beekeepers with bee activity. The turnaround day was December 15 with almost record temperatures and a cold front arrived on December 16 bringing 8-10 inches of snow to the District. A few Beekeepers were able to check on colonies and add supplemental feeding where necessary. Offers for nucs, queens and spring packages for spring delivery continued. Many organizations continued to offer zoom meetings and webinars on various topics related to beekeeping.

ALABAMA: A generally warmer, drier month of December meant that there were many foraging opportunities for colonies in Alabama. Workers returning to their colonies were frequently observed with corbicular pollen on their hind legs, a sign of active brood rearing. Capped brood in colonies likely reached its lowest amount of the year during mid-December, near to the equinox, but brood rearing then increased. As a result, most colonies in the state did not go broodless in December. Reports suggest that some beekeepers took advantage of the relatively low amounts of capped brood by performing oxalic acid sublimation treatments to manage the varroa mite. The COVID-19 pandemic continued to limit in-person beekeeper meetings, with some convening virtually. Beekeepers spent their downtime preparing for the spring.

ARIZONA: Temperatures were at slightly below normal levels across the state of Arizona during the month of December. The main nectar and pollen source for bees across Arizona during the month of December was desert plant bloom.

Dry, drought like conditions continue across the state. The entire state of Arizona is now under drought conditions, with 93.8 percent of the state under extreme drought conditions.

Bee activity across Arizona was fairly limited during the month. Beekeepers have been or are continuing to make preparations to move colonies to other locations, primarily California, for pollination of nut and fruit trees. Demand for honey remained good across Arizona.

ARKANSAS: During the month of December temperatures were about normal across most of the state. Precipitation during December was below normal across most of the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, Arkansas had normal to moderate drought conditions for December. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

CALIFORNIA: "This was not a good year for many beekeepers in California," one of the state's beekeepers said of 2020. "I suspect that a lot of it was due to the record high temperatures across the state, which hampered colony buildup late in the season." He didn't expect the industry to know the availability of bees till late January. But as of late December, supplies were looking tight due to substantial losses of colonies.

"We've gotten some rain, but not nearly enough," he said. "It looks as though California may be going back into a serious drought." "We are in the midst of our 'rainy season' here in California with almost no appreciable rain to date," another beekeeper said. "There was very little, if any, forage for the bees in December. Beekeepers continued to check colonies for weight and feed when necessary. Protein patties are being fed now as well."

Beekeepers also continue to split strong hivers to increase numbers of bees.

Because of an oversupply of nuts, there was little pressure by beekeepers to ask for high almond pollination rates. But if supplies of bees fall short, growers could bid up the price of the last hives to be placed, which could affect pollination rates for 2022. "It is too early to tell if there will be enough good hives for this year's almond pollination although there have been reports of some significant colony losses," a beekeeper said. "We will know in about a month. From what I have heard, it appears that almond pollination prices are in the same range as a year ago, \$180-210 per colony."

FLORIDA: Precipitation was about average for the month. Temperatures reached lows near or slightly below freezing several nights late in the month. These cold temperatures were a little earlier in the winter than normal. Bee health was considered to be about average to slightly below average. Mite treatments, which had recently been completed, were being repeated because the first treatments did not work as well as expected. Small hive beetles were also more of a problem in December than normal. The cold temperatures led to fewer than normal natural sources of food for the bees. Maple was beginning to bloom in South Florida late in the month. Some Spanish Needle also began blooming in Central and South Florida during the month, but there were few other plants blooming. Supplemental feeding was necessary and widespread across the state. Hive splitting was essentially completed before the end of the month in preparation for the annual almond pollination season in California. At least 80% of the commercial hives in Florida are expected to be moved to California beginning in early to the middle of January. Most will be moved before the middle of February when the pollination season could start. Every season is a little different and it could be early March, depending upon weather conditions, before the almond trees begin to bloom. Some beekeepers still have some Brazilian Pepper honey stored in the expectation of higher prices. Prices have been below last season's level since early November. Stored amounts of honey at the end of the month were fairly light with moderate demand. Orange blossom honey season will begin in March and be the next significant source of honey production in Florida.

GEORGIA: Wet conditions and cold temperatures at the end of the month had beekeepers watching the hives closely in preparation for splits and introducing new Queens for January. The bees are reported to be in good condition and feeding well with what was left in the hives for the Fall and some supplemental food to ensure they keep up weight and produce nucs. Sales are moderate from commercial buyers and still slow on the retail side off the farms. Wildflower \$1.80 out of the barrel, Tulip Poplar \$2.50 and Tupelo \$6.00 a pound in barrels.

IDAHO, COLORADO, UTAH: During the month of December, temperatures were above normal across most of Idaho. Utah had slightly below normal temperatures during the same period. Eastern Colorado saw slightly above normal to above normal temperatures while Western Colorado saw below normal temperatures for the month. Precipitation during December was slightly below normal across most of Idaho, Utah and Colorado. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, Idaho had normal to moderately dry soil conditions across most of the state except for, Central Idaho which had an area of severe to extreme drought. The entire state of Utah was covered by extreme to mostly exceptional drought. Colorado had mostly severe to an area of exceptional drought conditions in the mountains of the West during December.

Like most Americans, beekeepers from the three state area of Idaho, Utah and Colorado are ready for 2020 to be over. The dry conditions across most of the area for the year has taken a toll. Most commercial beekeepers have had hives in other states for most of the year. Most beekeepers in the three state area have moved their bees to intermediate locales until the annual almond pollination period in California. The pollination period usually starts around the middle of February on an annual basis. Locations where beekeepers currently have the commercial bee colonies include Southern California, Texas, and New Mexico. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

ILLINOIS: The weather for December has been mild overall with warm temperatures and only a few very cold days, with little snow and quite a bit of rain. The bees are ready for winter. Beekeepers are going to meetings, checking, and repairing equipment, and preparing to order packages in the new year from southern package producers. Demand for honey is good at the retail level and fairly good at wholesale level. Prices are generally unchanged.

INDIANA: The weather for December has had twelve days of above average temperatures with a small amount of snow and rainfall. Some Beekeepers report their bees in good condition. Beekeepers stopped supplemental feeding of their bees. Beekeepers are going to meetings and checking and repairing equipment. Demand for honey is good and demand exceeded supply at the retail level and demand was fairly good at the wholesale level. Prices are generally unchanged.

KENTUCKY: This year marks the seventh in a row that Kentucky has had at least one day in which temperatures reached the 60s in December. For beekeepers, that means that honeybees may start consuming their honey stores sooner than expected since there are few flowers available to collect nectar and pollen in bloom. Furthermore, a recent inspection of an apiary indicated a surprisingly large number of hives with brood still in the hives. Beekeepers have been advised to monitor for varroa mite populations, if weather permits, just to make sure that winter treatments are still effective. The goal is to get the honeybees as free of varroa mites as possible before the spring nectar flow so that the bees can be strong enough to collect both nectar and pollen. For beekeepers, getting a varroa mite sample and applying a treatment if necessary, will keep the varroa mite "wounds" down and the virus levels low through the winter.

Honey sales continue to be steady as the Certified Kentucky Honey Program has promoted its members' honey in a social-media promotion prior to Black Friday. In terms of education, although December is typically the time when beekeeper associations are finalizing their spring beekeeper school programs, Covid-19 has meant that few associations will meet in person if at all. Only a few associations have Zoom accounts, and cooperative extension offices are closed to the public for the foreseeable future. The new year brings challenges to educating the beekeeping industry in this state and the region.

LOUISIANA: During the month of December temperatures were below normal across most of the state. Precipitation was slightly below normal to below normal across the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, Louisiana had mostly normal soil moisture for December. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

MICHIGAN: The hives were quiet this month with very little flight time. It wasn't a bad month for the bees with the weather staying cool enough for them to remain inactive but warm enough to limit the consumption of winter honey stores. Healthy hives with low mite loads and plenty of honey supplies should do well if the mild weather continues. Demand for local honey was high in December at local stores and prices remain stable.

MINNESOTA: During the month of December temperatures were above normal across most of Minnesota. Precipitation was slightly below normal. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, most of the state had abnormally dry conditions.

With most of the hives moved to warmer climates December is normally a month of repairs and preparation for the coming Spring. Most commercial beekeepers already have their bees in warmer locations including Southern States and California.

Demand for Minnesota honey continues to be good for locally sourced honey. Prices for 2020 new crop range mostly from \$1.45-\$1.55.

MISSISSIPPI: The bees have stayed in the hives pretty much for the last month as cold weather continues to stick around. Beekeepers are hoping for a break in the weather so they can check on the hives and add supplemental food if needed. Bees are in pretty good condition heading into the new year. Wildflower \$1.68 lb in the barrel.

MONTANA: No report issued.

NEW ENGLAND: In New England the month of December experienced cold, seasonal temperatures with precipitation either from periods of heavy rainfall or storms producing snowfall which resulted in moderate moisture levels for the entire region. Early December weather was erratic with on and off cold and mild weather, whereby the bees early on had a chance to reorganize themselves, haul out the dead and go on cleansing flights. Nectar and pollen sources ended however, bees were working off the last late pollen sources which were from fall aster, heath, mum blossoms, perennial bachelor buttons and Johnny jump ups. Rapidly colder conditions finished all floral food sources for this season.

In New England all beekeepers have closed their hives for the winter and bees are snuggled in their hives. Bees are in cluster conditions. The winter has suddenly gotten a lot colder and these cold temperatures are stressful for bees however, snow is a good insulation against the cold. Winter will be about bees having enough food. Many beekeepers are expressing concern that bees are already at the top of the hives; which is extremely early in the winter and that indicates low honey reserves. Reportedly, low stores coupled with the usual cold, harsh weather of winter in the future will surely mean a high mortality rate for the overwintered population. As needed, colonies are being feed with fondant, protein patties, sugar candy.

Harvesting and extracting honey is completed. This year's honey crop numbers have not been finalized as some locations have exhibited very low production. Some yields are half what they usually are. This year's crop is turning out to be about 40% below average. Honey sales have been excellent going into the holiday season. Keepers have crafted many products from the fruits of their hives to sell for the holiday season primarily as stocking stuffers such as decorative honey decanters, candles, creams, lip balms and many edible holiday treats. The holiday season brings on an increase demand for local honey with the supply lower than normal. Demand at farmers markets and all retail/wholesale outlets are strong. Reportedly honey sales remain very good and continues to grow despite the recent price increases. Supplies of new crop locally produced honey are very short and in some places are scarce.

NEW YORK: Bee colonies looked good going into December. Colony boxes were heavy with honey and full of bees. The mild November weather helped with fall management, particularly colonies that might have needed extra care, by allowing keepers access to yards long past when cold or wet weather often prevents outdoor work to proceed. However, it is this same mild weather that can allow mites to migrate from crashing colonies to health ones through phoresies.

By now hives should be wintering with the cold weather preventing much of any activity. We have yet to see a warm day, January thaw in Dec, to inspect for any early winter losses. There undoubtedly will be some with a start to reporting of such. There will be an early rush for orders of Nucs, Packages and replacements needed for May. The irregular weather of warm followed by cold is stressful on bees resulting in more losses than any would like and bore beekeeper consternation, worry and efforts targeting prevention, some successful, some not.

Honey sales ramped up for the holidays in comparison to the fall. However, sales were muted by weak consumer purchasing power with reduced store, restaurant, or cafe foot traffic due to the pandemic. Price for a pound of honey ranges from \$7-\$9 with the higher price received for local varietal honeys. There are an unusually large number of honeys in grocery stores with unusual providence with questionable sources labeled.

Bulk sales have been slower than usual because honey sales overall have been slow leaving producers with more stores than might normally be available this time of year. Beekeepers look toward the new year with anticipation of fewer losses, lower production costs and better production.

NORTH CAROLINA: Temperatures in North Carolina trended on the higher side of normal for December with a statewide average temperature of 42.3°F. Precipitation was slightly above normal. Overall statewide soil moisture levels were rated 0 percent very short, 0 percent short, 19 percent adequate, and 81 percent surplus the week ending January 02. The North Carolina Drought Management Advisory Council reported zero counties as having outstanding drought or dryness.

Colony conditions varied greatly with apiary inspectors reporting some hives as looking very healthy, while others were weak due to varroa mite effects and queen failures. Mild temperatures in the southeastern region of the State kept bees active, which meant many beekeepers were having to feed their bees as well as continue to apply mite treatments as a result of bees continuing to produce brood. Possible pollen sources included ornamental evergreen shrubs such as camellias, but very few other plants had nectar or pollen available.

Commercial pollinator operations continued to rest and replenish hives in preparation for the California almond pollination season in February 2021. Those that do not plan on participating were rebuilding, giving their bees time to rest and replenish, while preparing/planning for local 2021 contracts. Demand for replacement bees was seasonally light as beekeepers do not want to feed and protect them throughout the winter.

Demand for honey was good, particularly due to holiday gift shoppers. Supply was moderate in the south-central region of North Carolina, while many beekeepers in the southeastern region were sold out. Retail prices at the Raleigh State Farmers' Market were generally unchanged: \$7.00-\$8.00 per 8 ounce jar, \$12.00-\$13.00 per 16 ounce jar, \$20.00-\$22.00 per 32 ounce jar, and \$18.00 per 44 ounce jar; processed honey, creamed, was \$10.00 per 16 ounce jar. Prices at the Piedmont Triad Farmers' Market in Greensboro were also unchanged at: \$8.00-\$12.00 per 8-ounce jar, \$12.00-\$18.00 per 22-ounce jar, and \$20.00 per 32-ounce jar.

NORTH & SOUTH DAKOTA: Winter has settled in with colder temperatures at home. Growers have been working on winter activities. Some bees have been moved to over winter locations around the country in advance of spring activities.

OHIO: December started and ended with warmer temperatures and often high winds sandwiching cold weather and snow. The Cleveland area started with 58° F temperature December 11 dropping to 15 degrees Dec 26 although the average temperature for the month was 34 degrees. Heavy snow (23.5") was received December 24 but it melted as temperatures warmed to 49 degrees at the end of the month. We have had a mild December, no major storms, and no cold spells. Cold enough to keep the bees in the hives but warm enough to break cluster to move about the hive. Have had a couple of days warm enough to take a cleansing flight. Honey prices remain stable \$5.00 to \$6.00 per pound wholesale and \$8.00 to \$10.00 per pound retail. Demand for honey has been good.

Youngstown (NE corner) averaged 34°F for the month with 60° F December 11th, but experienced 14°F weather December 26. Although the area received almost 3" of rain for the month, it also received 29" of snow!

Central Ohio (Columbus) differed in that it had high winds (29 mph) Dec 1 and 34 mph on the 22nd. Warmer days occurred early in the month (63° Dec 11) then dropped to 13°F December 26-27 and warmed again to 49° on the 30th. Although rainfall was below normal, it received almost 10" of snow for the month. December in Fairfield county has had several warm flying days for the bees. It has allowed the bees to collect from pollen feeders hopefully helping them through January and February. Some of the package bees installed in spring are already showing signs of stress. This is a good time to feed fondant or dry sugar and pollen patties directly on the top bars in the hives.

The southwest corner of Ohio was also low on rainfall (-2.35") but received 2.7" of snow. High winds occurred early in month and again toward the end of month (40 mph Dec 22-23!) then calmed ending with warm temperatures at the end of the month.

The average temperature was 36 degrees, yet it ranged from 64° December 11th to 11 degrees on Christmas Day. Total rain fall for 2020 is 1 inch below normal in some bee yard locations near Tipp City, Ohio, total rain fall for 2020 at my bee yards at Wright Patterson Air Force Base near Dayton, Ohio was 49 inches officially, 9 inches above normal, rain fall near my bee yards near Bellefontaine, Ohio, the highest elevation in Ohio at 1535 feet was at least 10 inches above normal. The colonies at Honda R&D near Marysville Ohio ended 2020 near normal rain fall. All bee yards had extended dry periods during the summer but are going into winter with adequate honey and pollen. Feeding dry protein flour for the foragers to feed on during temperatures above 45 degrees. All colonies have low mite populations, due to their genetics of Ohio Locally adapted Feral stock plus a light treatment for testing purposes. Our team caught 200 feral swarms this year in swarm traps. Ohio has a growing population of feral colonies in isolated areas near rivers at least 10 miles from commercial honeybees. December had several days that bees could fly for cleansing flights and feed on protein flour.

The warmer temperatures have allowed beekeepers to add protein and sugar where needed and provide some last-minute mite treatments. Based on reports from County Apiary Inspectors and other beekeepers, varroa mite levels were terribly high in October - November. Treating colonies already weakened and sick from poor mite management is often unsuccessful. Long range forecasts predict a warmer winter. Hopefully this will help beekeepers at least provide food for their colonies.

OKLAHOMA: During the month of December temperatures were about normal across most of the state. Precipitation during December was slightly below normal across most of the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, normal to moderate drought conditions exist in the Eastern half of the state. Normal to extreme drought conditions cover the Western half of the state. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey

OREGON: No report issued.

SOUTH CAROLINA: Brood production was lower the month of December due to extremes in temperature variations. Bees were clustered due to lower temperatures but were still managing to fly some during warmer days. An unusually warmer December has resulted in more bee activity with higher demand for nutrition. Bees were observed bringing in some pollen, though the source was unknown. The mite counts have continued to remain higher than desired. An Oxalic Acid vapor treatment was used in late December during a period of low brood in an attempt to reduce mite load.

Month of December experienced the highest honey sales volume of the year. Pricing reported: 2 oz \$3.00, 12 oz \$8.00-10.00, 16 oz \$10.00, 22 oz \$13.00-19.00, 32 oz \$15.00 and 80 oz \$45.00.

TENNESSEE: Tennessee had a mild December, no sources of nectar or pollen to report. Beekeepers are reporting colonies are overwintering well at this point. No reports of big losses in December. Covid-19 continues to negatively impact sales of honey across the state.

TEXAS: During the month of December temperatures were above normal across most of the state. Precipitation during December was below average to well below average across the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, drought conditions for December improved across much of the state. Central and Eastern Texas showing normal to moderate drought for the month and West Central to far West Texas having moderate to exceptionally dry conditions.

As 2020 comes to an end a lot of out-of-state bees have made their way to Texas. They will spend the next couple of months awaiting Spring before moving to California for the almond pollination or longer before moving back up North. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

WASHINGTON: Temperatures ranges slightly below to slightly above the average. Growers were active with winter activities including tree removal. A number of trees have been removed, mostly lower density plantings. Snowfall was light except in the mountains. In the last half of the month, snow in the mountains provided a start towards the snowpack that will provide irrigation water in 2021.

WISCONSIN: The weather for December was in line with seasonal temperatures with a few above average and a few below average days, with normal amounts of rain and snow. Beekeepers have prepared for the winter. Beekeepers have finished feeding their bees. Most beekeepers report that their bees are in good condition, some report a few dead hives. Beekeepers are going to meetings, checking, and repairing their equipment and preparing for the spring. Demand for honey is good at the retail level and fairly good at the wholesale level. Prices are generally unchanged.
