COLONY, HONEY PLANT AND MARKET CONDITIONS DURING SEPTEMBER 2021

APPALACHIAN DISTRICT (MD, PA, VA, WV): September had several very nice days as Autumn found its way to Appalachia. A few isolated showers and thunderstorms generated by the remnants of southern hurricanes dropped some precipitation on the area, but more moisture is needed as we exit the month. Beekeepers are checking hives and beginning winter preparations. Beekeepers are adding sugar solutions to hopefully avoid winter starvation and treating for varroa mites. They are also performing checks for small hive beetles. Bees foraged on fall blooming wildflowers, including asters, coneflowers, jewelweed, and goldenrod, for pollen and nectar.

ALABAMA: Northern parts of the state experienced significant rainfall from Hurricane Ida in early September; the rest of the month was generally categorized as warm and humid, with a few brief coolish periods. Golden rod and asters flowered throughout the state, although nectar and pollen production in southern areas only became apparent during the latter portion of the month. Cotton was also in bloom in various places, with reports of some nectar production. Beekeepers performed typical winter preparation activities – they pulled extra honey, fed colonies, and performed varroa control. A large number of small hive beetles were also reported. Beekeeper clubs met, some in person but also some electronically due to the ongoing COVID pandemic.

ARIZONA: No report issued.

ARKANSAS: During the month of September temperatures were well above normal across most of the state. Precipitation during September was below normal across most of the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, Arkansas had normal to abnormally dry soil moisture conditions for September. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

CALIFORNIA: California beekeepers suffered through drought and varroa mites this September. As a result, honey prices ahead could be higher. Beekeepers are still unsure what the ultimate effect could be for almond pollination rates. "Honey prices are up for those who were fortunate enough to extract some honey this year," one beekeeper said. "Due to drought in the West and Midwest, there is a smaller crop nationwide in 2021."

With almond pollination, "Better honey prices and high trucking costs may dissuade some Midwestern beekeepers from taking hives to almonds," another beekeeper said. "At this time, signs are that there will not be an excess of hives available for pollination."

Though some almond orchards are being pulled due to drought, about just as many coming are into bloom, so there may not be a big change in demand, he said. "I do not yet have a handle on the net bearing almond acreage which will require bees this coming February which will determine how many hives will be needed," another beekeeper said.

Lack of rain continued to hurt colonies in September. "Of course, the drought continues to negatively impact the almost non-existent natural forage, as well as the lack of irrigation water for agricultural uses throughout the state," a beekeeper said. "Some mature almond orchards have been removed due to lack of water, but there are still many younger orchards just coming into their productive years."

The La Niña weather patterns didn't look good for moisture for the Southwest for the winter ahead. Some beekeepers fear water cutbacks could be severe again next year unless California has a very wet winter.

"There was very little forage for the bees to work in September," a beekeeper said. "There was still a little cotton nectar available in a few parts of the Central Valley but pesticide applications for whitefly (to avoid sticky cotton) caused some bee mortality and in some cases the bees were moved away from cotton if the pesticides were applied during daylight hours. The remainder of the short honey crop was removed and treatments for varroa mites were common." "There is plenty of pollen for the bees, but no nectar," another beekeeper noted. "Most of the colonies are in good shape considering the lack of nectar."

Besides these factors, as well as higher costs for feed and labor, California beekeepers continue to face challenges with varroa mites.

"We had a few colonies where the mites have caused some losses, but we will see if the treatments slowed the problem," a beekeeper said. "We are preparing to move colonies into the winter holding yards from the vulnerable river locations ahead of a possible wet and flooding rainy season(hopefully)."

FLORIDA: Temperatures and precipitation were about average for the month. A few areas, particularly in South Florida and the Big Bend area had numerous afternoon thunderstorms. Many beekeepers had just finished or were finishing mite treatments. Bee health was considered to be good mostly because of good results for most who treated for mites. Supplemental feeding was necessary in many areas as Brazilian Pepper bloom generally started later than normal. Scattered wildflowers and a little Spanish Needle were available in limited amounts. Some Pepper bloom is expected to continue until close to the end of October. A lot of years most bloom is finished by the 15th to 20th of October. It will be sometime in October before any Brazilian Pepper honey will probably be pulled. Yields are expected to be about average as most areas had enough rainfall for a normal amount of bloom. Many producers were beginning preparations for the almond pollination season in California early next year. Drought conditions out west may lead to a decrease in almond tree acreage next spring if the water shortage is not soon alleviated. Almonds require more water to produce good yields than some potential crops that could replace almond tree acreage. An unknown amount of almond acreage has already been converted to other crop production. The number of Florida bees needed for almond pollination this year has yet to be determined but will probably be affected by the amount of irrigation water available to California almond producers. Some bees working in Michigan and the Dakotas were still returning to Florida in late September. The rest of these bees should return in early October. There was essentially no honey produced during the month for commercial uses. The amount of stored honey at the end of the month was very light.

GEORGIA: Beekeepers had plenty of rain to deal with but were able to work with the hives and check on the bees. Most are preparing the hives for the Fall and treating for mites and any remaining hive beetles. The bees are out foraging and bringing in food for later use. Some beekeepers are getting ready to supplement food if necessary. The Fall honey was reported to be average, and losses are running about 30-40 percent as usual. Sales are on the slow side but some gift sales are being taken for later.

IDAHO, COLORADO, UTAH: During the month of September temperatures were normal across all Western and Eastern Idaho. Utah had temperatures that were a little higher than normal across most of the state. Colorado had temperatures that were higher than normal across the Western side of the state for September. Temperatures were higher than normal for the Eastern side of the state. Precipitation during September was a lot lower than average for Utah, Precipitation for Eastern Idaho was a lot lower than normal for September, Western Idaho saw lower than average precipitation for the month. Western Colorado saw precipitation that was higher than normal. Eastern Colorado saw precipitation that was a lot lower than normal for September.

According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, Idaho had Severe drought to exceptional drought with a couple areas of moderate drought soil conditions. Utah is currently under extreme to exceptional drought conditions with a couple areas of severe drought with most of the state under extreme drought. The whole Western side of the state of Colorado is between Moderate dry to extreme drought with a small patch of exceptional drought, the Eastern side of the state is between no drought to moderate drought with mostly abnormally dry soil.

Demand for Locally sourced honey has been great throughout all three states, it has kept up with supply of honey. Most producers are done extracting honey with a few others just finishing up. They got a little more than average crop this year according to most of the producers. Most producers are keeping up with the demand for local honey in all three states.

Prices for the month of September were between \$1.80 and \$3.50 per pound with a mostly price of \$2.30-\$3.00 for Idaho, Colorado prices are \$1.75-\$1.95 per pound for local honey. Prices for locally sourced honey in Utah are average \$2.27-\$2.55 per pound.

ILLINOIS: Temperatures for the month of September were higher than normal. There were few days of rainfall. Some beekeepers are having problems with mites and beetles and are treating accordingly. Most beekeepers report that their bees are in good to excellent condition. Beekeepers also report a little bit of foliage for their bees to feed on, such as goldenrod and aster. Production has varied around the state. Some Beekeepers report a fair amount, while others say there has been very little production. Demand for honey is good at the retail level and fairly good at wholesale level. Prices are generally unchanged.

INDIANA: Temperatures for the month of September fluctuated from cooler to warmer. Than had average temperatures with the last days of the month having very warm temperatures. Rainfall in most parts of the state was above average for this time of the year. Beekeepers report that their bees continue to feed on foliage, such as goldenrod. Beekeepers report their bees in good condition and that they have a healthy population. Beekeepers report a presence of mites and have begun treatment with oxalic acid. Beekeepers report that they have had acceptable production in September. Prices are generally unchanged.

IOWA, KANSAS, MISSOURI, NEBRASKA: No report issued.

KENTUCKY: As Kentucky beekeepers begin their winter preparations, they are frustrated by inconsistent results with varroa mite samples of their hives. Some hives have low counts of varroa mites after a treatment, other hives have high counts (10 varroa mites-per-100 honey bees). These inconsistencies can happen in the same apiary.

Because of the alarmingly high rates of Corona virus in Kentucky, many bee associations have deferred hosting in-person meetings. Although the Kentucky State Fair did open in August, attendance was down approximately 40%. Nevertheless, sales of honey and value-added hive products from the hive were about average compared to previous years.

Now that the Fair is over, many local cooperative extension offices are closed to meetings for the foreseeable future. The two state beekeepers' associations (Kentucky State Beekeepers Association and the Kentucky Queen Bee Breeders Association) have moved their November meetings to an online format. Some associations have had outdoor field days, but lack of consistent meetings may also be contributing to a rise in hive mortality due to high varroa mite populations as well as viruses, etc. Beekeepers who started keeping bees in the past two years are simply uninformed about hive and pest management strategies.

As the winter approaches, both state bee associations have embraced online formats to reach members in the hopes of providing information to beekeepers in time for hives to be prepped by November.

LOUISIANA: During the month of September temperatures were below normal across most of the state. Precipitation was about well above normal across the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, Louisiana had normal soil moisture conditions for September. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

MICHIGAN: September has been a good month for hives as keepers swing into fall preparation. There was a fair amount of goldenrod honey brought in by the bees earlier this month. The bees are now working in earnest to fill their brood nest with aster honey and pollen for the coming winter. Beekeepers have also been feeding hives to insure adequate feed for the coming winter.

This month it was also essential to monitor for the Varroa mite. Stronger hives robbing weaker hives and hives crashing from viruses spread by the mites. These Varroa mite bombs can turn a healthy hive south in a hurry and beekeepers need to monitor and treat appropriately. Beekeepers are reporting good honey on hand, but many are reporting that crops were smaller this year as demand remains strong for local honey.

MINNESOTA: During the month of September temperatures were higher than normal across the south side of the state. Temperatures were higher than normal for the north side of Minnesota. Precipitation in September was below normal for the south side of the state, the north side of the state saw precipitation that was a little above average for September. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, in September northern Minnesota had Severe dry to extreme drought soil moisture and the southern part of Minnesota has abnormally dry soil to moderate drought with mostly moderately dry soil.

Supply for Minnesota honey continues to be good for locally sourced honey and producers are keeping up with the demand. Most producers are done extracting and got a little above average crop. Prices per pound in Minnesota were \$1.80-\$3.00 with mostly price of \$1.80-\$2.27 for locally sourced honey for the month of September.

MISSISSIPPI: The bees are reported to be in good shape heading into the Fall season. Hives have been treated for mites and are ready for the cold weather coming soon. The bees are still feeding when they can get out of the hives if the rain slows and weather permits. Sales for holiday purchases are starting to come in as well as candy makers making their yearly purchases.

MONTANA: No report issued.

NEW ENGLAND: This September's beekeepers have observed a significant uptick in capped honey and propolis in the yards, even as basswood nectar keeps flowing in changes are afoot. The changes in sunlight and season mean we're entering "bee autumn". After the solstice passes, and the primary nectar flows taper, the bees are fortuitously preparing for Fall and the pending Winter. They cap honey, and line every inch of the hive with propolis. Think of it like curing and carting up wood to heat your home. The preparations for the seasons ahead have begun. That means we're wrapping up our

last few weeks of queen production for the season, testing for mites and finishing up on our honey harvest. We're finally able to take a big sigh of relief. Bees have been working celthra alnifolia, Mexican & Chinese bamboo, fall aster, staghorn sumac, white & sweet clover, thistle, purple loose strife, button bush, assorted wild weeds especially knotweed, sweet pepper bush, assorted wildflowers and particularly golden rod. Other late food sources still blooming are buckwheat, Indian silk and coreopsis to finish the month. The ornamentals, joe-Pye weed, pickerel weed, sedum (stone crop) are out in abundance as well as jewel weed which leaves a slight white pollen mark on the thorax. Overall bees are working hard with a strong population buildup.

At this point in time, prices and demand for local and regional honey has been excellent and prices remain firm. Prices quoted for retail 1 lb. bottled units were \$12.00 to \$15.00 mostly \$12.00, occasionally higher, and 1 Quart bottled units were \$24.00 to \$30.00 mostly \$24.00, occasionally higher, inclusive of all varieties; and for all raw and natural honey depending on variety and quality.

Beeswax for brushing on plastic foundation is retailing mostly at \$10.00/lb. Propolis reportedly is \$18.00 to \$20.00 mostly \$18.00 for 2 ounces tincture and pollen is \$28.00 to \$32.00 mostly \$30.00 per quart. Retail bulk prices in dozen pint case lots at mostly \$110.00 and quart jar cases mostly at \$180.00 with 5-gallon units at mostly \$270.00 and occasionally lower for all raw and natural honey depending on variety and quality.

NEW YORK: September brought cooler, wetter weather but was too little, too late to break the August dearth for many areas. Some beekeepers are removing honey supers and feeding their bees earlier than usual. Goldenrod had an abbreviated flow and Japanese Knotweed seemed to predominate, resulting in dark honey with reddish tone. Parts of south-central areas in New York have had good year end harvest. Foliage mostly still green; frosts seem to be late this year. Some reports of increased presence of Small Hive Beetles in hives.

Honey demand remains strong. Bulk sales very brisk, with prices holding. Many producers counting on the Spring/Summer honey crop from 2021 and 2020 to meet sales demand.

NORTH CAROLINA: Temperatures in North Carolina were slightly above normal in September with a statewide average temperature of 71.0°F. Precipitation was generally below normal. Overall statewide soil moisture levels were rated 11 percent very short, 34.5 percent short, 53.5 percent adequate, and 1 percent surplus the week ending October 02. The North Carolina Drought Management Advisory Council reported 11 counties as being abnormally dry.

Dry conditions in the southeastern Coastal Plains limited nectar production but did allow for foraging of Goldenrod pollen. Bees could also be seen working Heartsease, Smartweed in the Piedmont, while Aster was available throughout the state. Colony conditions varied by management practices and experience, but most beekeepers spent September treating for varroa mites and preparing for winter. Apiary inspectors also reported heavy pressure from small hive beetles as well as a significant number of hives experiencing queen failures and a shortage of adult bees going into the fall and winter.

Commercial pollinator hives were winding down for the season and moved to Florida to take advantage of the Brazilian Pepper tree flow, while others began building up in anticipation of the California almond season, and others traveled out of state (south) to pollinate fall squash. Demand for replacement bees was seasonally light.

Demand for honey exceeded supply with supplies expected to be light until next spring. Retail honey prices at the Raleigh State Farmers' Market were generally unchanged: \$7.00-\$8.00 per 8-ounce jar, \$12.00-\$13.00 per 16-ounce jar, \$20.00-\$22.00 per 32-ounce jar, and \$18.00 per 44-ounce jar; processed honey, creamed, was \$10.00 per 16-ounce jar. Prices at the Piedmont Triad Farmers' Market in Greensboro were also unchanged at: \$8.00-\$12.00 per 8-ounce jar, \$12.00-\$18.00 per 22-ounce jar, and \$20.00 per 32-ounce jar.

NORTH & SOUTH DAKOTA: Water and soil moisture continued to average well below normal limiting some floral sources. Many crops moved closer to average harvest completion target dates but were still generally behind. Low moisture and drought conditions still existed and much of the range and pastureland was still in poor condition. Some bees were being prepared to be or moved other parts of the country.

OHIO: Southeast Ohio: The honey harvest is in and what a good year for Fairfield county beekeepers with an about average yield this year. The Goldenrod and Aster blooms are well underway with plenty of pollen being brought in for the fall season. It is now time to get that alcohol wash for Varroa Mite checks done to determine if treatment is necessary. Mite checks are showing some colonies with very heavy mite loads and others with very few mites. If pollen padders have not been fed this fall it is time to put some on so the bees and store it in the brood nest for winter brood startup. Now is a good time to get equipment cleaned up and stored for winter. It is also a good time to get winter hive tops and wraps ready to go, the weather could turn cold any day now.

Northwest Ohio: Even though the records will show a wet September, it was a great September. Sunny most days with above normal temperatures and only a couple of days of rain. Golden rod is now fading with asters starting. So far what fall flow we get could not be better for the bees. Most hives are heavy with honey heading into mid fall. Honey prices are increasing mainly due to container price increases and difficulty finding containers due to supply chain shortage. Honey prices remain stable \$5.50 to \$6.50 per pound wholesale and \$8.50 to \$10.50 per pound retail.

West Central Ohio: Rain fall has been adequate, weather warmer than usual which has provided great nectar and pollen flows in this area. Good honey crops and bee colonies are heavy going into fall. The Ohio locally adapted honeybees have low varroa, commercial honeybees have very high mite loads. The feral swarms we caught were fed protein for many months and are very strong going into fall. They have low mite loads.

OKLAHOMA: During the month of September temperatures were well above normal across most of the state. Precipitation during September was well below normal across the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, soil conditions were abnormally dry to moderate drought with a few areas of severe drought conditions scattered across the state. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey

OREGON: No report issued.

SOUTH CAROLINA: No report issued.

TENNESSEE: The fall nectar flow across the state has been patchy. Areas with frequent rain are reporting greater nectar flows. Goldenrod and asters have been the main nectar and pollen sources. Covid-19 spikes appeared to have slowed honey sales at farmers markets at times during the past month. We are seeing a surge in fall absconding swarms in weaker colonies.

TEXAS: During the month of September temperatures were about normal across most of the state. Precipitation during September was well below normal with a few exceptions scattered around the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, soil moisture conditions for September were normal to abnormally dry across most of the state including far West Texas. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

WASHINGTON: Temperatures down slightly although drought conditions continued early in the month. Harvest was winding down on peaches and nectarines, while pears, and apples continued in full swing. Wildfires burned in Central Washington continued to expand (over 100,000 acres) causing poor air quality. Bee activity was limited in smoke affected areas. More rain later in the month began to help with fire and smoke concerns. Topsoil moisture improved although longer term drought conditions remained.

WISCONSIN: Temperatures for the month of September were slightly higher than normal and rainfall was below average for the state of Wisconsin. Beekeepers have begun combating mites with miticidal strips and oxalic acid. They report a normal, healthy population of bees. Beekeepers report very little wild foliage for their bees with goldenrod and aster as the only flowers remaining. They have begun supplemental feeding of the bees. No production reported in September was reported. Demand for honey is good at the retail level and fairly good at the wholesale level. Prices are generally unchanged.
