COLONY, HONEY PLANT AND MARKET CONDITIONS DURING OCTOBER 2021

APPALACHIAN DISTRICT (MD, PA, VA, WV): October was warmer than normal and resulted in many spring blooming plants to push a few flowers out of season. Bees and other pollinators were able to take advantage of this late, spring like weather surprise to do some foraging on fall blooming wildflowers, like asters, goldenrod, and chrysanthemums, but also on a few spring bloomers as well. October temperatures did not produce a killing frost. Precipitation was scarce at the start of the month, but rains came at the end of the month alleviating some of the low soil moisture levels. Beekeepers are checking hives and beginning winter preparations. Beekeepers were preparing colonies for the winter with continued mite treatments, checking for small hive beetle, and adding supplemental food. Most have reported colonies are going into the winter very healthy and with good numbers.

ALABAMA: Colonies throughout the state enjoyed nectar and pollen from goldenrod and a variety of asters throughout October. As a result, some swarming occurred, and even some colonies became honey bound. Regardless, beekeepers checked food stores and colony strength repeatedly. Some feeding was necessary, and some smaller colonies were consolidated to single deeps to promote thermoregulation during the upcoming winter. By this point, diligent beekeepers had lowered varroa numbers, yet many were still experiencing high levels of small hive beetle. Beekeepers met via both online and in-person programming.

ARIZONA: After experiencing one of the wettest monsoon seasons on record for Arizona, state beekeepers said hives were full of honey in October. Forage and nectar continued to be ample well into the month. The rains also helped beekeepers see just how diverse the seed bed was in the Sonoran Desert, a beekeeper said. Mesquite bloomed twice in some cases. Creosote blooms were prominently visible. Citrus also played a factor.

All the same, the Arizona beekeeping industry remains limited, with hobbyists comprising much of the trade. Since those hobbyists rarely seek additional revenue from almond pollination in California, it's harder for them to generate enough income from beekeeping alone. Pollen patties don't come free, so most Arizona beekeepers need other jobs to pay bills.

African bees, which first arrived in Arizona in the late 1990s, also continue to pose challenges for Arizona beekeepers. The African bees are very defensive of their colonies. Rearing queens commercially in Arizona is nearly impossible, because the queens will mate with the African bees, which creates hostile working conditions for beekeepers, requiring plenty of smoke. The African bees can wipe out existing colonies. "Now it's just a different kind of beekeeping," a beekeeper said. "And you have to stay on top of it."

ARKANSAS: During the month of October temperatures were above normal across most of the state. Precipitation during October was normal to slightly below normal across most of the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, Arkansas had normal to mostly abnormally dry soil moisture conditions for October. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

CALIFORNIA: Forage remained limited for California bees in October, which will require continued feedings of sugar syrup and protein supplements ahead. "The rains were welcomed and settled the dust, but we are still a long way from getting out of the drought," a beekeeper said. "Of course, we are hopeful that additional rains will follow this winter and offer prospects for decent bee forage in 2022." "Honey production in California and the USA was extremely low this year due to drought," he added.

Another beekeeper had finished mite treatments and begun removing spent treatment debris. "Things are pretty much over as far as forage for the bees," he said. "We are in the process of moving all colonies to safe locations in anticipation of winter rains." Though most almond growers he worked with had enough water for the upcoming season, growers farther north weren't as lucky. "We still need a lot of rain to replenish the reservoirs as many of them are at only 5 to 10 percent of normal," he said. "All honey production has been over for months." His colonies had suffered about a 30 percent loss so far, but the surviving bees seemed to be in good shape. Another beekeeper noted that although some almond orchards had been removed due to lack of irrigation water, reports indicate that there would still be roughly 1.3 million acres of almond-bearing orchards in 2022.

FLORIDA: Temperatures and precipitation were about normal for the month with a few rainy days near the end of the month. Bee health was also considered about average with some treating for mites. Many were waiting for the end of Brazilian Pepper season which ended in various parts of Florida between the middle of October and the end of the month. They will then treat and split hives in preparation for the California almond pollination season beginning early next year. Other sources of nectar and pollen included Spanish Needle, mustard, Goldenrod, Mexican clover and other assorted wildflowers. Most of these also finished blooming about the same time as Brazilian Pepper. Supplemental feeding was then needed between the middle and the end of the month. The yield for the Pepper remained unknown at the end of the month. Many beekeepers were just beginning to pull honey from their hives at that time. Producers were trying to increase the price from last year's upper \$1's to the low \$2's. It remains to be seen if they will successfully obtain higher prices for this year's crop. Supply chain disruptions are causing some problems for Florida producers. One item that is in short supply and more expensive is wooden pallets to transport the hives to California. It is easier and quicker to navigate the hive inspection process at the California border with new pallets, so most Florida beekeepers transporting hives to California prefer to use them. This year may prove to be a challenge to obtain enough new pallets in a timely manner. Demand for honey was fairly good at the end of the month. Stored supplies of orange blossom, gallberry, palmetto and tupelo honey were light or very light at the end of the month.

GEORGIA: Beekeepers are checking the hives and have pulled honey for the season. Bees are out foraging what is left from all the rain over the last month to put extra food back before the cold weather comes in soon. It is expected to be an early, cold and wet winter so the beekeepers are making sure the bees are in good shape and the hives are treated before winter hits. Sales are average and online sales are doing fairly well for holiday purchases and cooking.

IDAHO, COLORADO, UTAH: During the month of October temperatures were normal across all Western and Eastern Idaho. Utah had temperatures that were normal across most of the state. Colorado had temperatures that were average across the Western side of the state for October. Temperatures were normal for the Eastern side of the state. Precipitation during October was a lot higher than average for Utah, Precipitation was a lot higher than average for the whole state of Idaho. Western Colorado saw precipitation that was higher than normal. Eastern Colorado saw precipitation that was a lot lower than normal for October.

According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, Idaho had moderate drought to extreme drought with a small area of exceptional drought soil conditions. Utah is currently under extreme to exceptional drought conditions with a couple areas of severe drought with most of the state under extreme

drought. The whole Western side of the state of Colorado is between Moderate dry to extreme drought, the Eastern side of the state is between no drought to moderate drought with mostly moderately dry soil.

Demand for Locally sourced honey has been good throughout all three states, it has kept up with supply of honey. Most producers are keeping up with the demand for local honey in all three states.

Prices for the month of October were between \$1.80 and \$3.50 per pound with a mostly price of \$2.30-\$3.00 for Idaho, Colorado prices are \$1.75-\$1.95 per pound for local honey. Prices for locally sourced honey in Utah are average \$2.27-\$2.55 per pound.

ILLINOIS: The weather for October has been good overall. Temperatures started the month higher than average but cooled off at the end with a lot of rain. The bees are reported to be in good condition. Treatment for mites has begun. For the bees, some foliage is still available, such as white and purple aster and a few Goldenrod. Demand for honey is good at the retail level and fairly good at wholesale level. Prices are generally unchanged.

INDIANA: The weather for October has been good with many warm days with above average temperatures and above average rainfall. Beekeepers report their bees in good condition and prepared for winter. Some beekeepers continued supplemental feeding of their bees. Beekeepers with mite problems have begun treating their hives. Demand for honey is good and demand exceeded supply at the retail level and demand was fairly good at the wholesale level. Prices are generally unchanged.

IOWA, KANSAS, MISSOURI, NEBRASKA: No report issued.

KENTUCKY: As far as October in Kentucky, this season has been a slow decline, with goldenrod, aster, even coneflowers blooming until Halloween. The honeybee colonies seem to be responding well, with few cases of disease reported or seen during USDA Honey Bee Health Survey collections. However, random alcohol wash samples indicated high varroa mite samples (15 mites per 100 honey bees in some samples) across the state. These random samples do not bode well for the winter.

LOUISIANA: During the month of October temperatures were above normal across most of the state. Precipitation was about below normal across the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, Louisiana had normal to abnormally dry soil moisture conditions for October. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

MICHIGAN: October was rather mild most of the month although it was damp and rainy. During the month the bees foraged some on wild aster blooming in the area, but most hives have been calm and inactive as the old field bees die off replaced by the winter bees. Any late feeding was finished up this month as the weather cooled down.

Beekeepers continue fall treatments as needed for Varroa mites as they prepare their bees for the winter ahead.

The Michigan beekeepers had their fall conference virtually with many great speakers however most bee clubs are meeting in person now as people adjust to the covid era.

Most beekeepers interviewed have indicated this year's honey production was lower than normal for them. Many are reporting they have good supplies of honey on hand as prices hold steady and demand stays strong.

MINNESOTA: During the month of October temperatures were higher than normal across the entire state. Precipitation in October was below normal for the entire state of Minnesota. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, in October northern Minnesota had moderate drought to extreme drought soil moisture and the southern part of Minnesota has abnormally dry soil to moderate drought with mostly abnormally dry soil.

Supply for Minnesota honey continues to be good for locally sourced honey and producers are keeping up with the demand. Prices per pound in Minnesota were \$1.80-\$3.00 with mostly price of \$1.80-\$2.27 for locally sourced honey for the month of October.

MISSISSIPPI: Lots of cold weather and rain in October was surprising as the beekeepers were getting the hives ready for winter coming in soon. Treatments for hive beetles and any mites are done and the bees are reported to be in good condition for the late Fall coming.

MONTANA: No report issued.

NEW ENGLAND: This month of October is the time to wrap up the honey production time frame in New England. There is a huge to-do list for all keepers. We are finishing up on golden rod, knotweed, buckwheat, thistle, Calendula, basil, jewelweed and hyssop. At that point in time, prices and demand for local and regional honey has been excellent and prices remain firm. Prices quoted for retail 1 lb. bottled units were \$12.00 to \$15.00 mostly \$12.00, occasionally higher, and 1 Quart bottled units were \$24.00 to \$30.00 mostly \$24.00, occasionally higher, inclusive of all varieties; and for all raw and natural honey depending on variety and quality.

Beeswax for brushing on plastic foundation is retailing mostly at \$10.00/lb. Propolis reportedly is \$18.00 to \$20.00 mostly \$18.00 for 2 ounces tincture and pollen is \$28.00 to \$32.00 mostly \$30.00 per quart. Retail bulk prices in dozen pint case lots at mostly \$110.00 and quart jar cases mostly at \$180.00 with 5-gallon units at mostly \$270.00 and occasionally lower for all raw and natural honey depending on variety and quality.

NEW YORK: October continued with the warmer wetter weather, with first frosts delayed by at least a month in most areas. Very wet conditions at the end of October preventing many beekeepers from accessing bee yards. Heavy feeding requirements for some hives needed due to poor mid-summer and fall honey crop. Reports of mite damage, small hive populations, and some fall dead-outs already.

Honey demand remains very good. Bulk sales very good, with prices holding. Evidence of reduced mid to late Summer stock beginning to impact supply.

NORTH CAROLINA: Temperatures in North Carolina were above normal in October with a statewide average temperature of 64.8°F. Precipitation was below normal. Overall statewide soil moisture levels were rated 6 percent very short, 27 percent short, 66 percent adequate, and 1 percent surplus the week ending October 30. The North Carolina Drought Management Advisory Council reported 50 counties as being abnormally dry and 9 counties as experiencing moderate drought conditions.

Dry conditions in the southeastern Coastal Plains continued to limit nectar production resulting in bees consuming their reserves and many beekeepers having to provide supplemental feed. Some areas of the southern Piedmont saw a bounty of blooms from Goldenrod and Aster, but many beekeepers in the region reported dry spells during which little nectar was produced. Queens began to reduce egg-laying and, according to apiary inspectors, many hives were weakened by the effects of varroa mites and the viruses that often accompany them. Small hive populations and heavy pest pressures were raising concerns for another winter of high losses.

Commercial beekeepers were either harvesting and processing honey or allowing their bees to rest and replenish in preparation for the 2022 season. Demand for replacement bees is seasonally light at this time as beekeepers do not want to feed and protect them throughout the winter.

Demand for honey is expected to increase during the holiday shopping season with a shortage of local honey expected as some beekeepers have already sold out. Retail honey prices at the Raleigh State Farmers' Market were generally unchanged: \$7.00-\$8.00 per 8-ounce jar, \$12.00-\$13.00 per 16-ounce jar, \$20.00-\$22.00 per 32-ounce jar, and \$18.00 per 44-ounce jar; processed honey, creamed, was \$10.00 per 16 ounce jar. Prices at the Piedmont Triad Farmers' Market in Greensboro were also unchanged at: \$8.00-\$12.00 per 8-ounce jar, \$12.00-\$18.00 per 22-ounce jar, and \$20.00 per 32-ounce jar.

NORTH & SOUTH DAKOTA: Water and soil moisture continued to be average, well below normal. Most crops were behind average harvest dates. Low moisture and drought conditions still prevailed. Much of the range and pastureland was still in poor condition. Most bees had been prepared for overwintering or had already been moved to their winter homes around the country.

OHIO: October looked a lot like September with green leaves, warm nights and sunny days and lots of rain (up to 2" in some counties). With no change in temperatures, the fall colors were delayed until the last two weeks when nighttime temperatures finally dipped below 40 degrees F. Toledo experienced its coldest temperature of 32 degrees but averaged 69 F for the month. Both Akron and Toledo had warm sunny days that reached 82 to 85 degrees, respectively. Dayton's low was 46 degrees but reached 90 mid-month. The average temperature for the month was 80 F! Columbus reached a low of 38 degrees, but had beautiful days that reached up to 86 F and averaged 71 degrees F.

Warm temperatures in October often spell disaster for honeybees because they are still active with no forage left to collect nectar or pollen. They resort to their own stored food and can literally eat a large percentage of their winter stores. Weaker colonies are also still being robbed by yellow jackets and can succumb to pests such as small hive beetles and wax moth larvae if not condensed and managed quickly. At this point, treating colonies for varroa mites may slow the infestation but will not mitigate the damage caused by the mites.

Northwest Ohio: Rain, rain and more rain. Very wet month with warm temperatures, most flowers have quit blooming, with our first spotty frost last weekend. Due to the warm days, robbing bees and yellow jackets have been a problem. The overall honey crop was average to below average. Finding containers to sell honey in are getting worse and prices are increasing with every order. Honey prices are \$5.50 to \$6.50 per pound wholesale and \$8.50 to \$10.50 per pound retail.

Southeast Ohio: The month of October has been unusual for Fairfield County with temperatures above normal for most of the month. Many fall plants continued to bloom most of the month and the bees were more active than normal for this time of the year. The first frost of the season is forecast for November 3, again very unusual for southeast Ohio weather. Mouse guards should be in place by now and those insulated top covers on, as well, with any winter wraps that you want to add. Many beekeepers are noticing that there are some lightweight colonies in the bee yards. Not sure why, unless it is due to the warm temperatures. So, feeding of pollen patties and fondant is recommended now so the bees can store it in the comb where they will need it this winter. The forecast is indicating that there will be some good flight days in November for the bees, acting now could save those weak colonies.

West Central Ohio: Ohio October weather was either too much rain or not enough. Also depending on the local nutrition ecosystem, the honeybees had adequate pollen and nectar, or the bees had little to none. Many beekeepers are feeding their bees to ensure they have enough nutrition for overwintering. Due to the pandemic issues many new and inexperienced beekeepers are not properly trained and are struggling to manage their honeybees properly. Ohio Locally Adapted Honeybees, (Rescued Feral Honeybees) are controlling varroa populations using different behaviors, (phenotypes) successfully.

OKLAHOMA: During the month of October temperatures were above normal across most of the state. Precipitation during October was above normal across the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, soil conditions were abnormally dry to moderate drought with a few spots of severe drought conditions scattered across the state. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

OREGON: No report issued.

SOUTH CAROLINA: No report issued.

TENNESSEE: During the month of October temperatures were above normal across most of the state. Precipitation during October was well normal to slightly below normal with a few exceptions scattered around the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, soil moisture conditions for October were normal to a few areas of moderate drought scattered across of the state. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

TEXAS: During the month of October temperatures were above normal across most of the state. Precipitation during October was well normal to slightly below normal with a few exceptions scattered around the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, soil moisture conditions for October were normal to a few areas of moderate drought scattered across of the state. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

WASHINGTON: Fall rains helped ease drought conditions as well as range fires also. Topsoil moisture improved greatly. Growers prepared for winter as the harvest was winding down later in the month. The fall rains helped the Wildfires Central Washington and the air quality returned to normal. Beekeepers were preparing hives for overwintering.

WISCONSIN: The weather has been good for October with warm temperatures and lower than average rainfall. Beekeepers continue to test for mites and those showing them present are being treated. Beekeepers report that there is no more wild foliage for their bees. Some beekeepers have finished feeding their bees, while others continue to feed them. Most beekeepers report that their bees are in good condition and with the warm weather the bees

are going out on cleansing and orientation flights. Demand for honey is good at the retail level and fairly good at the wholesale level. Prices are generally unchanged.
