COLONY, HONEY PLANT AND MARKET CONDITIONS DURING NOVEMBER 2021

APPALACHIAN DISTRICT (MD, PA, VA, WV): November started balmy, but soon turned very cold and blanketed the area with the first hard freeze. As apple growers were hurrying to get apples harvested, which most had completed by the second week of the month, beekeepers were checking colonies and providing supplemental food in preparation of the winter months. By the end of the month, the weather was fairly balmy. Colonies were doing some flying during the warmer than normal days. A few small beekeepers reported some mite issues. The area received needed scattered precipitation during the month as well.

ALABAMA: Below average precipitation throughout the month of November led to abnormally dry conditions in many regions of Alabama by the end of the month. Some goldenrod and aster remained blooming; however, flowers of most other plants fizzled out. Southern regions experienced camelia bloom later in the month. Possibly due to the lack of forage because of dryness, many colonies experienced a broodless period mid-November. As a result, beekeepers applied oxalic vapour in the hopes of controlling the varroa mite. Beekeepers also monitored their colonies for food stores, although most reported that their colonies were sufficiently heavy and therefore did not need additional food. Some clubs met for their monthly meetings; others met for year-end festivities in the run up to Christmas.

ARIZONA: Though forage continues to dwindle, and honey production remains limited for Arizona's bees, area beekeepers say they should continue to make good revenue this season from their hives pollinating the California almond crop.

In previous years, there have been more trees than bees, a local beekeeper said. "Maybe this year we will be more even," he added. Given higher operating costs this year, some beekeepers from farther east may opt not to transport hives to California.

For many years, Arizona beekeepers relied on cotton as their staple crop for honey, but newer varieties don't yield as much. The growth in dairy farms has created a greater need for alfalfa, which also produces honey. But because flowers on plants can affect milk production in cows, the dairy industry prefers the alfalfa to be cut earlier, which also limits honey production. Not to mention, spreading housing developments continue to shrink alfalfa acreage in the Phoenix metro area, the beekeeper said. Though watermelons and cantaloupes are still grown commercially around Phoenix, the pesticides used for the crops can prove lethal to bees, which can be costly for beekeepers, especially the hobbyists who comprise much the trade. So today domesticated bees in Arizona often rely on mesquite and wildflowers for forage. Often the honey produced doesn't go much beyond what's necessary to maintain hives. Most revenue for Arizona's commercial beekeepers comes from placing hives nearby in California almond orchards during pollination. "It's good money," the beekeeper said.

ARKANSAS: During the month of November temperatures were below normal across most of the state. Precipitation was well below normal for most of the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, Arkansas had normal soil moisture across the Northern part of the state and moderate drought conditions across the southern part of the state for November. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

CALIFORNIA: Unusually warm weather caused California bees to keep flying well into November. Instead of settling, colonies continued to forage and rear broods. But as dry conditions continued, pollen remained scarce. "There are little to no blooming plants at this time, and the bees are mostly flying for water," a beekeeper said. "Most colonies are in decent shape but have slowed brooding. We desperately need rain.

There was virtually no forage for bees in the central portion of California the whole month, another beekeeper said. "The rainfall event in late October germinated some annual plants that the bees might be able to work by late December or early January if we receive some more rain one of these days, but many of these plants will likely dry up before they bloom if the rains do not materialize in time," he said.

Meanwhile, drought conditions also continued to concern almond growers, some of whom have cut back irrigation for orchards, which in turn will affect markets for pollination. "The supply and demand for almond pollination is a hot topic among beekeepers this month," a beekeeper said. "The drought will be impacting the growers, but those with water will likely get a good price for their nuts. Costs to the beekeepers (feed, labor, trucking) have been going up. Midwestern beekeepers, who are getting a decent price for their honey, may not find it to be worthwhile to haul their hives to California." "The irrigation water situation in the Central Valley remains dire due to the drought, and it was just announced that state water contractors are scheduled to receive no water next year, which will severely impact almond growers in the western portions of Kern, Kings, and Fresno Counties," another said. "It is still too early to know how many almond growers might not rent any beehives for the upcoming bloom due to lack of irrigation water. We are still praying for much needed rain!"

As bees roamed away from hives into November, they further risked exposure to varroa mites and weakening colonies before almond pollination. Some beekeepers who saw higher levels of mites planned second treatments for their hives. Others considered the costs before acting. "I have heard that some beekeepers are not trying to keep poorer colonies alive, as this process is costly, and the benefits, although lucrative, do not outweigh the costs," a beekeeper said.

FLORIDA: Precipitation and temperatures were about average for most of Florida. Bee health was considered to be about average for most of the state, but good in the Panhandle region. There were more natural food sources in the Panhandle than most other areas of the state. Supplemental feeding was not necessary for a large part of the month in that area. Goldenrod, Spanish Needle, some mustard, and other assorted wildflowers were available. Most other areas in Florida required supplemental feeding for most of the month. Cooler weather was shutting down broods resulting in a minimal amount of hive splitting. Brazilian Pepper honey production was probably about average. Beekeepers were happy to receive higher prices than they had anticipated. Some were reporting sales in the \$2.10-\$2.25 per pound range. Very good demand for honey is expected to result in even higher prices later in the winter. This combined with higher trucking rates to transport hives may result in more Florida bees skipping the almond pollination season in California to produce more Florida honey. The almond pollination season typically starts in early February. Stored supplies of honey at the end of the month were fairly light with very good demand.

GEORGIA: The bees are reported to be in good condition as treatments have been completed to keep beetles and mites under control. A light freeze hit the Northern areas of the state late in the month, otherwise the weather has been rather mild with warm days, cold days and rain. This abrupt change in temps can confuse the bees keeping them in the hives and then it gets warm again and they are out foraging and then it gets really cold and they are back in the hives. The bees have been foraging when they can get out of the hives for wild turnips, other wildflowers and Red Maple. Beekeepers are supplemental feeding the bees for winter after pulling the fall honey crop. Prices are about steady with a good demand. Some small hobbyists are not replacing their hives as needed. The extra expense and time needed to take care of the hives properly are making people realize that this is a commitment and unless you do the work and put in the time you will keep losing bees and not producing honey.

IDAHO, COLORADO, UTAH: During the month of November temperatures were above normal across all Western and Eastern Idaho. Utah had temperatures that were above normal across the entire state. Colorado had temperatures that were above average across the Western side of the state. Temperatures were also above normal for the Eastern side of the state. Precipitation during November was a lot lower than average for Utah, precipitation was a little below average for the whole state of Idaho. Western Colorado saw precipitation that was lower than normal. Eastern Colorado saw precipitation that was also a lot lower than normal for November.

According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, Idaho had moderate drought to extreme drought with most of the state under severe drought soil conditions. Utah is currently under Severe to exceptional drought conditions with most of the state under extreme drought. The whole state of Colorado is between Moderate dry to extreme drought.

Demand for Locally sourced honey has been good throughout all three states, it has kept up with supply of honey. Producers are keeping up with the demand for local honey in all three states.

Prices for the month of November were between \$2.20 and \$3.50 per pound with a mostly price of \$2.30-\$2.50 for Idaho. Colorado prices are \$1.75-\$1.95 per pound for local honey. Prices for locally sourced honey in Utah are average \$2.27-\$2.55 per pound with mostly \$2.27-\$2.36.

ILLINOIS: The weather for November started off cold with slightly warmer temperatures in the middle of the month, with a normal amount of precipitation. Treatment for mites continues. No foliage remains. Most felt no need to supplement the feeding of the bees. Most beekeepers report that their bees are in good condition, but there are a few reports that some hives are completely dead. Demand for honey is pretty good at the retail level and fairly good at wholesale level. Prices are generally unchanged.

INDIANA: The weather for November has been about average with a few cold then warm days in the middle of the month, with a normal amount of precipitation. Beekeepers report their bees in good condition. Few beekeepers continued supplemental feeding of their bees. No foliage remains. The bees are ready for winter. Demand for honey is good and demand exceeded supply at the retail level and demand was fairly good at the wholesale level. Prices are generally unchanged.

IOWA, KANSAS, MISSOURI, NEBRASKA: No report issued.

KENTUCKY: In November, Kentucky beekeepers who had not monitored or treated for varroa mites began reporting dead-outs, as early as the first week in November. In two cases, the apiaries had high varroa mite counts. In one case, multiple dead varroa mites were clearly visible on the landing board. In another apiary, there were obvious signs of Chronic Bee Paralysis virus, i.e., the "shiny" or "greasy" appearance that a bee with the virus exhibits. Beekeepers were urged to sample and apply Apibioxal, the EPA-approved oxalic acid miticide, or Hopguard as a "clean-up" treatment, but if beekeepers have not been treating their honeybees throughout the summer and fall, they may find that Apibioxal at this point in the year will not be as effective as it could have been if the varroa mite populations had been kept low throughout the year.

Both state associations (i.e., the Kentucky State Beekeepers Association and the KY Queen Bee Breeders Association) held their annual meeting online with guests Danielle Downey (Executive director of Project Apis m. and Dr. David Tarpy, North Carolina State University) providing excellent discussions about queen bee genetics, varroa tolerance, etc. Even as activities begin to slow down due to winter, the associations are meeting and defining their goals for 2022 with optimism.

LOUISIANA: During the month of November temperatures were below normal across most of the state. Precipitation was well below normal. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, Louisiana had normal soil moisture across Southern Louisiana and moderate drought conditions across Northern Louisiana for November. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

MICHIGAN: Most beekeepers are finished prepping for winter, only a few beekeepers are still finishing up their Varroa mite treatments for the year. The weather has been cool with little chance for cleansing flights.

This is the month for bee equipment sales and many have made their plans for the upcoming season and purchased their equipment to assemble during the winter months. Honey sales have been good leading into the holiday season.

MINNESOTA: During the month of November temperatures were higher than normal across the entire state. Precipitation in November was a little below normal for the entire state of Minnesota.

According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, in November northern Minnesota had abnormally dry soil to severe drought soil moisture and the southern part of Minnesota has no dry drought to moderate drought with mostly no dry soil.

Supply for Minnesota honey continues to be good for locally sourced honey and producers are keeping up with the demand. Prices per pound in Minnesota were \$2.20-\$4.00 with mostly price of \$2.20-\$3.00 for locally sourced honey for the month of November.

MISSISSIPPI: The bees are in good shape and the hives are ready for the cold months ahead. Treatments have been completed to prevent problems from the small hive beetle and mites. Plenty of rain came through and temperatures go up and down like a seesaw. Prices remain steady.

MONTANA: No report issued.

NEW ENGLAND: November has been a very active month as all New England Beekeeping associations have embraced the usage of zoom technology and have been active throughout this pandemic discussing their usual fare of beekeeping methods and embracing their new beekeepers that have taken classes through their club associations.

There are some queens from as far back as 2020 are doing great and most keepers hives are showing that they have tight brood patterns and lots of brood! Reportedly, New World Carniolans have been creating high levels of pollen and nectar. Stronger hives made some nice light clover (*Trifolium repens*), and a bit of staghorn sumac (*Rhus typhina*) honey. Staghorn sumac is starting to fade. Basswood (*Tilia americana*) was promising but never really got going in high production numbers. The orange Solidago spp. pollen is delicious. The New England pollen flow was excellent this year, and the best here since 2011 as well as being very tasty! Japanese knotweed flow is starting to finish up. Knotweed likes rain before the blossom time. This was the latest bamboo flow registered and is a new bamboo record for New England. Different plants need different conditions to produce well for the bees. New England keepers have been supering, feeding pollen patties and syrup to nucs and checking the queens. At that point in time, prices and demand for

local and regional honey has been excellent, and prices remain firm. Prices quoted for retail 1 lb. bottled units were \$12.00 to \$15.00 mostly \$12.00, occasionally higher, and 1 Quart bottled units were \$24.00 to \$30.00 mostly \$24.00, occasionally higher, inclusive of all varieties; and for all raw and natural honey depending on variety and quality.

Beeswax for brushing on plastic foundation is retailing mostly at \$10.00/lb. Propolis reportedly is \$18.00 to \$20.00 mostly \$18.00 for 2 ounces tincture and pollen is \$28.00 to \$32.00 mostly \$30.00 per quart. Retail bulk prices in dozen pint case lots at mostly \$110.00 and quart jar cases mostly at \$180.00 with 5-gallon units at mostly \$270.00 and occasionally lower for all raw and natural honey depending on variety and quality.

NEW YORK: November has settled into a cooler weather pattern with periodic snow. Feeding of hives continues due to the poor late Summer and Fall nectar flow. Most hives have been prepped for winter and beekeepers are planning applications of winter varroa mite treatments such as oxalic vapor and dribble. Some hives still have brood because of the warmer than average temperatures. Continued reports of high mite counts and mite damage, small hive populations, and some fall dead outs. Honey demand remains very good. Bulk sales and prices good, still holding.

NORTH CAROLINA: Temperatures in North Carolina were fairly normal in November with a statewide average temperature of 49.4°F. Precipitation was below normal with drought expanding and intensifying across the State. Overall statewide soil moisture levels were rated 10.5 percent very short, 40.5 percent short, 48 percent adequate, and 1 percent surplus the week ending November 27. The North Carolina Drought Management Advisory Council reported 29 counties as being abnormally dry and 49 counties as experiencing moderate drought conditions.

Colony health varied by management skills and effort. Beekeepers who properly managed colonies looked very healthy, while those that did not were experiencing declining health by late fall with many hives reportedly succumbing to or being weakened by Varroa mites and issues associated with them. Dry weather conditions ended the fall nectar flow in late October leaving many hives at high risk for starvation if not provided supplemental feed. Where available, bees could be seen working Aster; Heartsease, Smartweed; Bitterweed; Joe-Pye Weed; Sunflower; and Goldenrod. According to apiary inspectors, queens responded to the limited resources by stopping their egg laying efforts earlier than normal. Low populations and low stores cause concern that a cold winter could freeze many more hives to death.

Commercial pollinator operations continued to rest and replenish hives (ensuring hives had enough food and not too many pests) in preparation for the 2022 pollination season. Replacement bee operations were also resting and replenishing hives; demand for bees at this time remained seasonally light as beekeepers do not want to feed and protect them throughout the winter.

Demand for honey was fairly good, especially for "local" honey, as the holiday shopping season began. Supplies were light as some beekeepers had already sold out. Retail honey prices at the Raleigh State Farmers' Market were generally unchanged: \$7.00-\$8.00 per 8-ounce jar, \$12.00-\$13.00 per 16-ounce jar, \$20.00-\$22.00 per 32-ounce jar, and \$18.00 per 44-ounce jar; processed honey, creamed, was \$10.00 per 16-ounce jar. Prices at the Piedmont Triad Farmers' Market in Greensboro were also unchanged at: \$8.00-\$12.00 per 8-ounce jar, \$12.00-\$18.00 per 22-ounce jar, and \$20.00 per 32-ounce jar.

NORTH & SOUTH DAKOTA: Water and soil moisture increased; however averages were still below normal and low moisture conditions still prevailed in many areas. Much of the range and pastureland continued to be in poor condition. Harvest was generally completed for most commodities. Bees had been moved to their overwinter homes around the country.

OHIO: Southeast Ohio: The weather has finally changed to winter very quickly. Some hives were not as prepared as others were for this cold spell. If you do not have your mouse guards on by now, it may be too late. The days, for the most part, are reaching temperatures in the forties which is allowing the bees to move the feed (fondant and pollen patties) down into the brood areas for wintering. The queens have all stopped laying and the brood is emerging. It is not too late to put out pollen feeders to start attracting the feral bees. They can be out all winter, and you should keep filling them as needed. The scout bee will visit them on warm winter days. It is a good time to start looking ahead to spring by cleaning up any equipment you have lying around the yard and honey house. Christmas is coming, so, planning a new equipment list for next year can be handy.

West Central Ohio: The area has received above normal rainfall with temperatures above normal range. Heavy frosts have killed the pollinator flowers. Honeybee foragers are looking for protein to store for brood rearing starting the last of December. Feeding protein flour in outdoor feeders is a great management tool. Some beekeepers are feeding colonies that are light. Varroa mites are a problem in many hives and must be killed as soon as possible. Most beekeepers have a good supply of honey to sell. Obtaining containers for selling honey is difficult at times with prices creeping up. Beekeepers are keeping their honey prices at normal prices to their customers. Locally adapted honeybees are healthy going into winter. Based on activity at the protein flour feeders, the feral honeybees are strong going into winter.

OKLAHOMA: During the month of November temperatures were above normal across most of the state. Precipitation was below normal across the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, soil conditions were normal to severe drought conditions across most of the state with a few areas of extreme drought conditions in the far West part of the panhandle. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey

OREGON: No report issued.

SOUTH CAROLINA: No report issued.

TENNESSEE: Dr. Mike Studer, State Apiarist, Tennessee Department of Agriculture reports that in Tennessee, "The only sources of nectar and pollen in November were small wildflowers. Retail honey prices from beekeepers are moving above \$10.00 per pound, many saying they are having to raise prices to \$12.00 per pound due to the rise in costs associated with producing the honey. There have been reports from beekeepers of absconding colonies in the last month."

TEXAS: During the month of November temperatures were above normal across most of the state. Precipitation was below normal with a few exceptions scattered around the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, soil moisture conditions for November were normal to severe drought across most of the state including far West Texas. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

WASHINGTON: Colder weather along with fall rains continued to ease drought conditions. Snow fell in the mountains seasonally closing some passes. Growers finished the last of the apple harvest and continued preparations for winter. Beekeepers had moved hives to their over winter locations.

WISCONSIN: The weather for November looks slightly more cloudy than last year, but close to average. Extremes are well outside the average highs and lows, but the average looks to be similar. Precipitation was low and way behind the cumulative totals for the year. Beekeepers have prepared for the winter. Beekeepers report that there is no more wild foliage for their bees. Most have finished treatment for mites. Some beekeepers have finished feeding their bees, while a few others continue to feed them. Most beekeepers report that their bees are in good condition. Demand for honey is good at the retail level and fairly good at the wholesale level. Prices are generally unchanged.
