COLONY, HONEY PLANT AND MARKET CONDITIONS DURING DECEMBER 2021

APPALACHIAN DISTRICT (MD, PA, VA, WV): December temperatures were above normal for the early part of the month, but by the end temperatures had returned to more seasonable levels. Beekeepers continued to check colonies and provide food on an as needed basis.

ALABAMA: Alabama experienced generally warm and dry conditions throughout most of December. As a result, brood rearing greatly increased as we moved towards the new year. Observations of drone brood, even in Central parts of the state, at Christmas were unusual for this time of year. Beekeepers continued to apply mite treatments, especially in the early part of the month in a response to low brood levels earlier in November. Colonies food stores were generally ok, and due to previous stores and some flowering plants, like henbit, hairy buttercup, dandelion, and camelias. Foraging workers were frequently seen bringing pollen back to their colonies. End of year beekeeper meetings occurred throughout the state.

ARIZONA: Arizona bees foraged from barley, wheat and alfalfa during December as well as wildflowers. Pasture and range conditions were mostly fair to good, with topsoil and subsoil moisture mostly adequate.

In the western part of the state, freezing temperatures have affected pasture and range conditions. In the south-central part of the state, forage growth has continued. Significant precipitation was received in the southeastern and south-central part of the state.

Arizona beekeepers continue to monitor the progress of almond pollination markets in California, where bloom should occur in early to mid-February.

ARKANSAS: During the month of December temperatures were normal across most of the state. Precipitation during December was normal to below normal across most of the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, Arkansas had normal soil moisture across the Northern part of the state and abnormally dry to moderate drought conditions across the central and southern part of the state for December. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

CALIFORNIA: Late December rains should result in greater forage ahead for California bees, and honey markets have gained strength following an antidumping suit filed against some foreign producers. Plus, despite acreage being cut in some almond orchards, pollination rates so far for hives have been holding at last year's levels. But some California beekeepers still see challenges ahead from storm damages and hive losses. The unexpected precipitation came after a long stretch of drought. "The December rains helped with our ground moisture and will facilitate the early blooming willows and mustards," a beekeeper said. Another noted the hills in Central California were green with plenty of snow higher up in the mountains, which should help with crop irrigation. "The rains have been wonderful and bode well for a better year in 2022, but more rains are needed if we are to have a good honey crop this year," another beekeeper said. "There are a few flowers blooming now that the bees are working for pollen in some areas in advance of almond bloom."

"I think many are optimistic about it being a good honey year," another said. Following a recent antidumping suit, markets for honey had climbed roughly 30 to 60 cents to around \$2.50 per pound in bulk.

Though temperatures have risen recently, December conditions were generally too cool for bees to forage. "We are beginning to inspect the colonies for strength and brooding to see how many of them need supplemental help," a beekeeper said. "During December the only colonies we opened were the ones that needed feeding as we wanted to ensure a viable colony was being fed. It was too cold to do much else, and possibly harm the bees." Recent relatively warm weather late in the month had allowed some California beekeepers to feed their colonies for stimulation. Another beekeeper noted that while colony health looked good for live colonies, the number of dead out hives had continued to climb. "Many beekeepers have already encountered 20 percent dead colonies or more," he said.

Almond pollination usually begins in mid-February, though bloom times can fluctuate with the weather. "The big questions, as far as almond pollination, is whether the drought in the Midwest will affect (bee) supply, as well as whether there will be enough trucks and drivers available to move them to California," a beekeeper said. "And that's on top of the question of how many orchards are going to be pulled due to water restrictions."

Although the late December rains provided welcome relief to drought conditions, 2021 remained a challenging year for many beekeepers. "Between the drought last summer, the fires, the flood in December (which washed away 50 of our hives), then this storm, it's been very tough for our bees and us," a beekeeper said. "To add insult to injury, the winter had not been cold enough for the bears to go into hibernation, so when the snowstorm covered our electric fences, bears were able to move in and destroy two holding yards of hives."

FLORIDA: Temperatures were above normal for most of the month. Precipitation was about average in most areas. Some parts of South Florida received a little more rain than normal. Bee health was considered to be strong with good hive numbers. The warmer weather caused Titi to begin some bloom in late December. It would normally start blooming in late January to early February. Titi is typically found near creeks and rivers and provides sustenance for about 6-8 weeks. Gallberry would usually start to flow about the time Titi is finishing. There could be a gap this year between Titi and Gallberry flow if Gallberry does not begin earlier than normal or Titi lasts longer than usual. Even with the warmer temperatures, some supplemental feeding was necessary. Mustard, a little Spanish Needle, and other assorted wildflowers were available in many areas. Maple also became available by late December. Beekeepers are presently expected to send about the same number of hives to California for almond pollination as they did last year. Increased trucking rates are expected to be at least partially offset this year by higher pollination fees, resulting in similar profits to previous years being returned to the beekeepers.

GEORGIA: Beekeepers have tried to stay on top of things for the upcoming cold months ahead. December had some extremely cold days and evenings, but they did not last very long and the sun came right back. Plenty of rain kept bees in hives but they have been able to get out about on sunny, warm days. Unusual December weather this year. The bees are reported to be in good shape after having the hives treated earlier and some are being fed with supplemental sugars just to keep the weight on since the forecast calls for more cold weather. Some small clubs are not holding in person meetings and some retail buyers have shifted to online and not direct sales due to Covid 19 and Omicron. Many hobby beekeepers have called it quits for various reasons, mostly the expense to keep going and maintaining proper healthy hives.

IDAHO, COLORADO, UTAH: During the month of December temperatures were higher than normal across all Western and Eastern Idaho. Utah had temperatures that were higher than normal across the entire state. Colorado had temperatures that were above average across the Western side of the state for December. Temperatures were above normal for the Eastern side of the state. Precipitation during December was more than average for Utah, Precipitation was normal for the whole state of Idaho. Western Colorado saw precipitation that was a lot more than normal. Eastern Colorado saw precipitation that was lower than normal for December.

According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, Idaho had abnormally dry to extreme drought with most of the state under moderate drought soil conditions. Utah is currently under Severe to extreme drought conditions with most of the state under severe drought. The whole state of Colorado is between Moderate dry to extreme drought with most of the state under Moderate drought.

Demand for Locally sourced honey has been good throughout all three states, Producers are also keeping up with the demand for local honey in all three states. Most hives are in storage or in warmer climates waiting to send their hives to California for Almond pollination.

Prices for the month of December were between \$2.20 and \$3.50 per pound with a mostly price of \$2.30-\$2.50 for Idaho, Colorado prices are \$1.75-\$1.95 per pound for local honey. Prices for locally sourced honey in Utah are average \$2.27-\$2.55 per pound with mostly \$2.27-\$2.36.

ILLINOIS: No report issued.

INDIANA: No report issued.

IOWA, KANSAS, MISSOURI, NEBRASKA: No report issued.

KENTUCKY: Kentucky beekeepers had several unwelcome December gifts in the form of tornados. While the majority of the commercial beekeepers had already taken their hives to other states in November, several sideliner and hobbyist beekeepers had losses of their hives or the tops of their hives. In addition, a few counties had several buildings damaged, so association meetings were postponed or cancelled. The Covid virus variants also continued to wreak havoc on beekeeper associations' plans for educational events. With the new variant Omicron arriving in December, some associations decided to postpone their spring weekend schools or host the educational events online. There were some bright spots: the Kentucky State Beekeepers Association received a grant to continue its Certified Kentucky Honey Program, and even had a booth at the Kentucky Farm Bureau annual meeting, generating honey sales for honey producers. The Kentucky State Beekeepers Association also provided a link on its website to beekeepers who have lost hives due to tornado damage in an effort to help offset losses. It may be worth noting that December 2021 was the third-warmest December on record in Kentucky, i.e., it was 75F on Christmas Day in Lexington, KY.

LOUISIANA: During the month of December temperatures were above normal across most of the state. Precipitation was below normal across the northern part of the state and normal across the southern part. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, Louisiana had normal soil moisture across Southern Louisiana and moderate to severe drought conditions across Northern Louisiana for December. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

MICHIGAN: December has had moderate weather with a few opportunities for cleansing flights. Mostly it has been cool enough to keep the bees in a cluster, but not so extreme as to cause undue stress or excess food consumption from bitterly cold weather.

Local honey has been in high demand at holiday craft markets and stores. The price is holding well. This month beekeepers were spending their time preparing their equipment and planning for next season.

MINNESOTA: During the month of December temperatures were normal across the entire state. Precipitation in December was a little more than normal for the entire state of Minnesota.

According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, in December northern Minnesota had abnormally dry soil to severe drought soil moisture and the southern part of Minnesota has no drought to moderate drought with mostly no dry soil.

Supply for Minnesota honey continues to be good for locally sourced honey and producers are keeping up with the demand. Prices per pound in Minnesota were \$2.20-\$4.00 with mostly price of \$2.20-\$3.00 for locally sourced honey for the month of December.

MISSISSIPPI: A cold and wet December has beekeepers working as much as they can when time and weather permits. Supplemental feeding has the bees in pretty good shape in preparation for a cold and icy January. Orders for queens and nucs are coming in.

MONTANA: No report issued.

NEW ENGLAND: Early December weather was erratic with on and off cold and mild weather, whereby the bees early on had a chance to reorganize themselves, haul out the dead and go on cleansing flights. Nectar and pollen sources ended however, bees were working off the last late pollen sources which were from fall aster, heath, mum blossoms, perennial bachelor buttons and Johnny jump ups. Rapidly colder conditions finished all floral food sources for this season. Over wintering procedures entails installing mouse guards, entrance reducers and insulation boards between inner and outer covers and/or boards under the bottom screens to ensure proper ventilation.

In New England all beekeepers have closed their hives for the winter and bees are snuggled in their hives. Bees are in cluster conditions. The winter has suddenly gotten a lot colder, and these cold temperatures are stressful for bees however, snow is a good insulation against the cold. Winter will be about bees having enough food. Many beekeepers are expressing concern that bees are already at the top of the hives, which is extremely early in the winter and that indicates low honey reserves. Reportedly, low stores coupled with the usual cold, harsh weather of winter in the future will surely mean a high mortality rate for the over wintered population. As needed, colonies are being feed with fondant, protein patties, sugar candy.

In New England, the average consumption is 60 lbs. of honey throughout the winter. Steady cold weather lowers the rate at which honeybees consume honey stores. If the weather pattern stays cold, it won't hurt the bees if the hives have good ventilation. In New England, hives normally lose at least 10% of their population due to winter related issues however, the past few years, winter losses are more in the 30 to 40% range. Cold weather will not adversely affect bees as much as condensation will. Colonies should be ventilated to abate this problem.

NEW YORK: December was a roller coaster for weather in New York, with above normal temperatures persisting; above normal precipitation for western and northwestern regions. There were plenty of days for bee cleansing flights. Beekeepers are finishing up winter management and varroa mite treatments. Winter stores of honey in many hives are less than expected for this time of year, with frequent monitoring and assessment for supplemental feeding needed. Beekeepers have started placing orders for packages and queens in preparation for the Spring.

Local beekeeping clubs proceeding with online, Zoom beekeeping classes due to Covid. Holiday sales of honey were very good, with very good prices. Bulk wholesale demand and prices holding.

NORTH CAROLINA: Temperatures in North Carolina were above normal in December with a statewide average temperature of 49.7°F. Precipitation was once again below normal with drought conditions covering over 85 percent of the state. The North Carolina Drought Management Advisory Council reported 14 counties as being abnormally dry, 36 counties as experiencing moderate drought conditions, and 50 counties as experiencing severe drought conditions.

Mild temperatures across the state allowed bees to forage into late December. Possible pollen sources included ornamental evergreen shrubs such as camellias, but very few other plants had nectar or pollen available. The opportunity to forage could be helpful to hives that may have been lacking adequate stores going into winter, but there could also be call for concern if the increased activity utilizes more energy than what they collect while foraging. This could be problematic if temperatures dip in January and February. It is important that beekeepers continue to monitor stores and supplement carbohydrates and protein, if necessary, to avoid starvation. Apiary inspectors also noted that the unseasonably warm temperatures may encourage colonies to start building brood, which means varroa mite reproduction may also get an early start for the 2022 season. Another mite issue noted in December was varroa-transmitted viruses; bacterial brood diseases were noted as seasonally light, but varroa-transmitted viruses were reported as somewhat common.

Commercial pollinator operations continued to rest and replenish hives in preparation for the 2022 California almond pollination season. Those that do not plan on participating were rebuilding, giving their bees time to rest and replenish while preparing/planning for local 2022 contracts. Demand for replacement bees was seasonally light as beekeepers do not want to feed and protect them throughout the winter.

Demand for honey was good, particularly due to holiday gift shoppers. Supply was light and quickly sold out at many locations. Retail honey prices at the Raleigh State Farmers' Market were generally unchanged: \$7.00-\$8.00 per 8-ounce jar, \$12.00-\$13.00 per 16-ounce jar, \$20.00-\$22.00 per 32-ounce jar, and \$18.00 per 44-ounce jar; processed honey, creamed, was \$10.00 per 16-ounce jar. Prices at the Piedmont Triad Farmers' Market in Greensboro were also unchanged at: \$8.00-\$12.00 per 8-ounce jar, \$12.00-\$18.00 per 22-ounce jar, and \$20.00 per 32-ounce jar.

NORTH & SOUTH DAKOTA: Winter precipitation helped raise topsoil moisture averages although they were still below normal to normal. Water shortages at home have put a strain on bees and colonies and will likely have an effect on bees that have been moved to their overwinter homes around the country.

OHIO: December was a warm, wet month with temperatures in the 60's, even after Christmas. The above average temperatures allowed honeybees to fly and prompted some spring bulbs to emerge from the ground in central Ohio. Akron in NE Ohio, had temperatures from a low of 21°F to a high of 70°F. Cincinnati (SW Ohio) had similar temperatures ranging from 20° F in early December to 70° at the end of the month.

Southwest Ohio received over 2" of rain however most of Ohio has remained soggy with saturated soils and more rain expected. The only record of snow was in Portage County (SE of Lake Erie) which received half an inch.

Northwest Ohio: The month of December continues the trend of warmer and wetter than normal. No real cold nights yet, in fact there has not had a night in the teens yet. Most days were in the 30's and 40's. Bees are able to break cluster and fly about once a week. Most hives look good going into winter. Honey prices are \$5.50 to \$6.50 per pound wholesale and \$8.50 to \$10.50 per pound retail.

West Central Ohio: December weather was abnormal, above average rain and temperatures. High winds occurred several times, as high as 70 MPH for several hours. Due to the pandemic, most bee clubs in Ohio have not been meeting, as a result new beekeepers are struggling with their bees. Many beekeepers are feeding both carbs and protein, queens start laying eggs last week of December in Central Ohio. With the amount of moisture in the soil in Ohio, moisture is a concern in hives not properly winterized. The willow trees are ahead of schedule by about a month because of many days with temperatures in the 60s. Silver and Red Maple trees are also showing early signs of bud stage.

Honeybees have been searching for pollen or sugar sources with limited success. Beekeepers should check their colonies for resources as with the higher temperatures they have remained active and may have consumed all their food stores.

OKLAHOMA: During the month of December temperatures were normal across most of the state. Precipitation during December was well below normal across the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, moderate to extreme drought conditions covered the state in December. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey

OREGON: No report issued.

SOUTH CAROLINA: No report issued.

TENNESSEE: Tennessee has been warmer than normal throughout the month of December. The bees have been consuming their winter stores at a higher rate than normal. Beekeepers have had to feed colonies to keep them alive. Colonies across the state have been bringing in small amounts of pollen and nectar from dandelion and other winter wildflowers. Honey is selling retail for \$10.00 to \$12.00 per pound.

TEXAS: During the month of December temperatures were well above normal across most of the state. Precipitation during December was below normal. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, soil moisture conditions for December were normal to severe drought across most of the state including far West Texas. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

WASHINGTON: Some late fall rains fell early in December, while snow began falling by mid-December. The snowpack grew considerably as the snow fell in late December setting the stage for a good winter snowpack, and eventually enough water for summer irrigation.

WISCONSIN: No report issued.
