COLONY, HONEY PLANT AND MARKET CONDITIONS DURING AUGUST 2022

APPALACHIAN DISTRICT (MD, PA, VA, WV): Hot, humid weather was the forecast for most of August as the dearth of pollen and nectar continued. There were a few isolated showers and thunderstorms throughout the month, but overall, the District was dry. Several beekeepers reported bearding activity on the hottest days. Beekeepers harvested honey and overall reported a fairly average volume collected. Those that did have lower than expected honey volume were hoping for a good goldenrod bloom, which started about two weeks earlier than normal this year. Beekeepers were also providing syrup, water, and treating for mites as needed. A few beekeepers reported having issues with small hive beetles. Some states were conducting registrations for fall beginning beekeeping classes. Prices for cartons 12 1-pound containers at the Jessup wholesale market were \$85.00 per case for wildflower and clover honey. Many beekeepers are noticing more different flavor and color honey this year as bees gather pollen and nectar where they can find it.

ALABAMA: A dry July and early August transitioned in nearly daily precipitation in most parts of the state by mid-August; often that precipitation was heavy. As a result, nectar was in short supply and colony stores of honey and beebread declined as it was consumed by bees. Beekeepers remained vigilant against small hive beetle, and varroa treatments continued as colonies were prepared for fall and winter. Many water hemlock species were in bloom, especially in wet ditches and swamps. Sneezeweed, ironweed, and black eyed Susan were also abundant. In northern parts of the state and areas of higher elevation, goldenrod flowers made an appearance. Many beekeeper clubs met in person, especially for their summer field events or fellowship cookouts.

ARIZONA: Heavy rains and adequate soil moisture helped to improve forage growth for bees in northern Arizona this August. Monsoon rains continued to diminish drought levels throughout the month for the state.

Statewide, pasture and range conditions were rated mostly fair to good. Forage conditions also improved for the southeastern part of the state. In the northwestern part of the State, adequate soil moisture conditions improved alfalfa, grass hay, sweet corn, and specialty crop conditions. Rains caused flash flooding in some areas. In the western part of the state, water reductions affected forage growth, and alfalfa and cotton crop progress.

ARKANSAS: During the month of August temperatures were well above normal across most of the state. Precipitation during August was slightly below normal across most of the same area. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, Arkansas had moderate drought conditions across most of the state with an area of extreme drought along the northern border.

No supply chain issues reported. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

CALIFORNIA: On the upside, California honey markets hovered around nearly \$3 a pound toward the end of August. Then again, harvest came late, and supplies remained scarce. "We finally started extracting honey during the second week of August, which is the latest date we have ever started extracting honey since I started my business in 1978," a beekeeper said. Honey was sourced mostly from cotton as well as alfalfa in some areas.

"The bees also collected pollen from melons, corn, and a few wildflowers especially in areas with irrigated pasture," he added. "We are very thankful for the honey, even though this is likely to be the smallest honey crop we have ever produced."

Another beekeeper had moved his bees out of vegetable seed pollination and begun feeding them sugar. "No honey was produced at all," he said. "There are some wildflower plants blooming producing some pollen, but no nectar. We will start treating for varroa mites now that the weather has finally cooled down."

"We don't know how the extreme (110-118 degrees) heat affected the bees yet. We did not even attend to the bees during those two weeks. Too hot." Another beekeeper noted that despite August's brutal heat wave, the honey harvest was good. The big question now for many beekeepers is the demand for hives ahead for almond pollination. "I foresee some weakening in almond prices as the water situation and poor almond crop has many growers in poor financial shape," one beekeeper said.

FLORIDA: August weather was about normal with hot temperatures, some dry areas and scattered afternoon thunderstorms. The Panhandle area seemed to receive more precipitation later in the day where it was more beneficial. Cotton, wildflowers including Spanish Needle, and sumac were some of the sources of nectar for the bees in the Panhandle. Some of this honey was sold and some beekeepers were leaving it for the hive. Supplemental feeding was less needed in that area than in most of the rest of the state. Bee health was considered to be about normal for August in Florida which would be considered slightly less than average in almost any other month. Cabbage palm and goldenrod were available in South Florida first and then eventually in Central Florida. Cabbage palm was becoming less available in Central Florida by the end of the month. Central and South areas of Florida needed to supplemental feed for most of the month. Bees started returning from other states such as the Dakotas, Michigan, Wisconsin, and New York early in the month. Most bees are expected to be back in the state before the Brazilian Pepper season starts around the middle of September. The health of bees returning in many cases was a good or better than the bees that remained in the state. Beekeepers were splitting hives, feeding, and trying to treat for mites to build their hives before the start of Brazilian Pepper. One of the best mite treatments needs about a week of high temperatures in the 80's for the best results, which does not happen often in August. Other mite treatments were not working as well as desired for some beekeepers. Some stored tupelo honey was sold during the month, but other packers were holding on to supplies expecting higher prices. Demand for honey remained good with light supplies stored at the end of the month.

GEORGIA: Beekeepers are treating hives all year for mites and beetles. Those that do not treat are reporting heavy losses and this has hobby beekeepers having issues with costs, etc. The weather had hot days and wet days but most were able to get out and work. Honey volume is about average, and losses are reported average as well around 30-40% loss depending on the area the hives are kept. Whatever the beekeepers are not pulling from the hives will be left for the Fall for food. Prices are higher than in normal years and most sales are from commercial buyers. Hobby producers are meeting in person, and some are still working online to get information out and encourage sales. With schools open it has helped move more honey, but many individual buyers are only purchasing what they need and not storing as much with prices the way they are. The good news is that the covid virus seems to be taking a backseat for now to the flu so hopefully this pandemic is over soon.

IDAHO, COLORADO, UTAH: During the month of August temperatures were above normal across all Western and Eastern Idaho. Utah had temperatures that were above normal across the entire state. Colorado had temperatures that were normal across the entire state. Precipitation during

August was well above average for Utah, Precipitation was below average for western Idaho, eastern Idaho saw above average precipitation. Western Colorado saw precipitation that was below normal. Eastern Colorado saw precipitation that was normal for August.

According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, in August Idaho had no dry soil in the panhandle and abnormally dry soil to severe drought in the rest of the state, with a couple small patches of extreme drought. Utah is currently under severe to exceptional drought conditions with most of the state under extreme dry soil conditions. The whole state of Colorado is between no dry soil to severe drought with most of the state under moderately dry soil.

Prices for the month of August were between \$2.35 and \$3.50 per pound with a mostly price of \$2.40-\$3.00 for Idaho, Colorado prices are \$2.30-\$2.70 per pound for local honey. Prices for locally sourced honey in Utah are \$2.50-\$3.00 per pound with mostly \$2.80-\$3.00.

ILLINOIS: The weather for August was volatile with many high temperature days with less than normal rain. Beekeepers report that most of their bees are in good condition and report mite problems. Beekeepers are using formic acid to control the mites. Beekeepers also report that there is some foliage, such as goldenrod, clover, Basswood and Black Locust left for the bees. Beekeepers report that this year's production is excellent overall. Demand for comb honey is excellent. Demand for honey is good at the retail level and very good at the wholesale level with wholesalers. Prices are generally unchanged with some lower wholesale prices.

INDIANA: Temperatures for the month of August were higher than average and there was lots of rain. The bees are said to be in good condition. Formic acid is being used to combat problems with mites. Beekeepers report reasonable amounts of honey production. Demand for honey is good at the retail level and fairly good at the wholesale level. Prices are generally unchanged.

IOWA, KANSAS, MISSOURI, NEBRASKA: No report issued.

KENTUCKY: As summer winds down in Kentucky, beekeepers have experienced intense heat in July and unexpectedly pleasant temperatures in August. There were 21 days over 90F in July compared to just 5 (as of this writing) in August. The state also experienced intense rainfall at the end of July. Eastern Kentucky received over 8 inches of rain in eleven hours. Some apiaries washed away in the middle of the night. In some cases, the roads to apiaries washed away, leaving the hives safe but impacting the ability of the beekeeper to harvest honey or treat. In another part of the state, there was one case of European foulbrood. And in spite of the devastation in Eastern KY, many beekeepers have been in full preparations for the Kentucky State Fair.

LOUISIANA: During the month of August temperatures were well above normal across most of the state. Precipitation was below normal across the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, Louisiana had abnormally dry to moderate drought conditions across most of the state. No supply chain issues reported. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

MICHIGAN: August has been warmer than normal with adequate rain. Honey flows in many areas were limited or nonexistent for most of the month. Bees in some areas did forage on star thistle and goldenrod where it was available. Other plants available for forage in limited quantities were Dutch clover, sweet clover, alfalfa, wildflowers, and many herbs such as oregano, anise hyssop, and mints. Beekeepers continued honey removal and extraction this month as most are reporting better crops this year. Prices are strong with the demand high for honey. Some commercial beekeepers are forgoing pollination services and strictly managing for honey production because of the strong price of honey. Also of concern is the continued rise in beekeeping equipment and supplies. Varroa mite monitoring and treatments continue this month to stay on top of the viruses vectored by these mites. Mites tend to build up in hives this time of year and many required treatments this month.

MINNESOTA: During the month of August temperatures were normal across the entire state. Precipitation in August was also normal for the entire state.

According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, in August the entire north end of the state of Minnesota had no dry soil and the south end of the state is mostly abnormally dry soil to no dry soil with a small patch of moderate dry soil.

Prices per pound in Minnesota were \$2.25-\$5.00 with mostly price of \$2.80-\$3.75 for locally sourced honey for the month of August.

MISSISSIPPI: August was a hot and wet month. The honey flow is over, and quality reported as good. Goldenrod is coming in and bees are expected to make a nice Fall crop. Most are treating the hives with Apivar for routine maintenance at this time and preparing for the Fall months coming up soon. Commercial sales are reported as good with higher prices.

MONTANA: No report issued.

NEW ENGLAND: No report issued.

NEW YORK: The mid-summer nectar/honey dearth impacted parts of New York State, with abnormally dry conditions in the western and south-central regions, the Hudson valley, and Long Island. Additionally, areas of moderate drought conditions that are occurring within these regions may affect the fall nectar flow, despite a welcome significant rainfall at the end of August. Goldenrod, purple looserstrife, and Japanese Knotweed blooming, with some reports of an earlier than usual bloom. Beekeepers doing varroa mite assessment and treatment, now that colony honeybee populations begin to decline for the winter, but the varroa mite parasite numbers are ascendent, infecting brood with viruses. Honey sales remain strong with higher prices being realized with a price ranging of 7.00-18.00 for 1 pound jars retail; honey sales competition increasing.

NORTH CAROLINA: No report issued.

NORTH & SOUTH DAKOTA: Despite normal warmer summer weather topsoil and subsoil moisture were generally adequate all around. Sunflower bloom was about 50% at the beginning of August, but generally completed by the end of the month well behind the average dates. The same warm conditions stressing sunflowers and other crops aided in the 2nd cutting of alfalfa and by the end of the month nearly completed. Well ahead of both last season and the average.

OHIO: No report issued.

OKLAHOMA: During the month of August temperatures were well above normal across most of the state. Precipitation was well below normal across the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, there was severe to extreme drought across most of the state.

OREGON: No report issued.

SOUTH CAROLINA: No report issued.

TENNESSEE: August in Tennessee has seen the start of the fall flow in the higher elevations. Goldenrod and asters were the main sources of nectar and pollen in the higher elevations. At lower elevations beekeepers are experiencing a nectar and pollen dearth. There have been no serious pest or disease issues during August. Beekeepers are selling their honey for an average of \$16.00 per pound with specialty honeys selling for \$24.00 per pound. Supply chain issues continue to be a factor with obtaining glass queen-line honey containers according to beekeepers.

TEXAS: During the month of August temperatures were consistently well above normal across the state. Precipitation during August was again below normal across the entire state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, soil moisture conditions for August showed soil moisture conditions from moderate to extreme drought conditions across the state. August was extremely hot and dry.

Once again, the very few showers that were scattered around the state certainly provided temporary relief for the few lucky areas that received them. Truck availability is not an issue, currently, due to lack of supplies. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

WASHINGTON: Dry and warm but generally seasonable conditions continued into August. Soft fruit harvest continues, though some of the vegetable and berries were stressed by the heat. Hay went from 2nd to third cuttings. While generally hot, above normal temperatures prevailed later in the month stressing berries, floral sources, some other crops, lowering soil moisture, it aided in hay harvesting. As the cherry harvest wound down, Bartlett pear harvest began followed by early apple varieties.

WISCONSIN: Temperatures for the month of August were warm. There was a lot of rain for this time of year. Beekeepers report that there are a few problems with mites. Generally, bees are in good to excellent condition. Little foliage remains, including goldenrod, for the bees. Some beekeepers report that production was good, while others report that it was just mediocre. Demand for honey is good at the retail level and fairly good at the wholesale level. Prices are generally unchanged.
