**COLONY, HONEY PLANT AND MARKET CONDITIONS DURING OCTOBER 2022**

**APPALACHIAN DISTRICT (MD, PA, VA, WV):** October has been beautiful with the change of leaf colors and with a few passing storms throughout the month. Temperatures for the most part have been mild and warmer than normal although there were a couple of early mornings where frost occurred. There has not been a hard freeze yet. Humidity levels are low and colonies foraged on late blooming fall perennials such as goldenrod and asters. Beekeepers continued to provide food and water and mite treatments; however, a few are reporting mite infestations. Many beekeeping organizations and groups are preparing for participating in fall meetings and conferences. Prices for wildflower and clover honey cartons 12 1-pound containers at the Jessup wholesale market were lower at \$80.00 per case.

**ALABAMA:** Like previous years, goldenrod, sunflowers, and other various asters provided nectar and pollen for honeybee colonies throughout the month of October. Production was likely hampered by dry weather, with much of the state experiencing abnormally dry or even moderate drought-like conditions. Although some colonies swarmed as a result of the forage, most colonies were fed by beekeepers in preparation for winter because they had fewer stores than usual. Some beekeepers also finished up varroa mite treatments. Beekeepers continued to meet in person and virtually.

**ARIZONA:** No report issued.

**ARKANSAS:** During the month of October temperatures were well above normal across most of the state. Precipitation during October was well below normal across most of the same area. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, Arkansas had severe to an area of extreme drought conditions in the North Central part of the state.

Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

**CALIFORNIA:** Though October rains brought relief to many California beekeepers, they say much more will be needed ahead for them to succeed in 2023. Plus, water remains tight enough in the state that acreage is being pulled from almond production, which in turn could lower rates for pollination this winter. "The recent rain and snow are a promising start to our 'rainy season,' but we will need much more if 2023 is to be a good year for bees," a beekeeper said. "Almond pollination demand in 2023 will depend upon the amount of available irrigation water for the orchards. Beekeepers and almond growers are hoping for average precipitation or better in order to help get out of the drought."

The rain helped hives by giving mustard and other plants a good start for growth. It also settled dust and eliminated many of the fire hazards near bees. "We are still seeing some pollen coming from unknown sources, but it appears to be helpful for the bees," a beekeeper said. "We are feeding syrup as there is no nectar associated with the pollen." Water availability remains a concern for almond growers, enough that some have sold their land only to see the trees removed by new owners. "Water is becoming more of an issue for irrigation, with other growers also pulling trees," a beekeeper said. "As this decreases the need for bees, I foresee a drop in pollination rental fees. We will see how it all washes out."

While some beekeepers are offering to drop pollination fees, others say the move might be premature, especially since the supply of Florida hives "took a big hit" due to recent hurricanes. California beekeepers might also see their supply of hives adversely affected if they can't keep mites under control.

Just as California almonds rely heavily on bees for pollination, so do other crops burgeoning around the world. "Right now, Peru is having a gold rush for beekeepers, due to the sudden demand for pollination colonies for massive new blueberry plantings," a California beekeeper noted.

**FLORIDA:** The effects of Hurricane Ian were felt for the entire month of October and will probably affect the number of Florida bees available for California almond pollination early next year. Temperatures were cooler than normal after Ian with practically no precipitation for most of the month. Rivers, creeks, wetlands, and lakes continued to rise for about 2 weeks or more after the storm, even with no additional rain. It was late in the month before most of the floodwaters were mostly contained in their banks. Brazilian Pepper, a staple for bees from mid-September until mid or late October, was destroyed in large areas. There was almost no honey produced for commercial sales during September. This resulted in large financial losses for many beekeepers. It is estimated that in Southwest Florida about 400,000 hives suffered some type of storm damage with potentially 100,000 hives totally destroyed. Honey stored in these hives was also lost. The storms' path through Central Florida also damaged many hives. Areas along the eastern coast, especially around the St. Augustine area, also suffered significant damage. Bee health was considered poor in all of these areas with supplemental feeding a necessity. The Panhandle area escaped most storm damage and bee health was fairly good. Goldenrod and Spanish Needle began blooming around the middle of October in the Panhandle and other scattered areas around the state. Some bees returned to the state after the storm and were in fairly good shape. Late October into early November is usually a popular time to gather hives in Southwest Florida to split hives and rebuild colony health for the almond pollination season in California early next year. The lack of natural sources of food in this area may result in Florida having less bees available for pollination in California this year. Almond supplies seem to be larger than usual this year which would possibly indicate that less bees will be needed for pollination in California early next year.

**GEORGIA:** The beekeepers are busy preparing the bees and hives for the winter months. Putting out extra feed and maintaining winterizing treatments to keep the bees in good condition while waiting for the cold weather to come in. Normal losses reported about 30% and some may have up to 40% losses while keeping the hives productive. The Fall pull was not as good as the Tupelo and Sourwood this year. Some beekeepers have reported a 50% crop this year while getting ready for the holiday sales which has started out a little slow as prices have increased. Baker grade was \$3.00 lb. Premium grade at \$6-6.50 per pound

**IDAHO, COLORADO, UTAH:** During the month of October temperatures were well above normal across Idaho. Utah temperatures were well above normal across the state. Colorado temperatures were well above normal across most of the entire state. Precipitation during October was slightly below average for Idaho, Utah, and Colorado.

In Idaho harvest is done for most producers and most of them say it was an average crop or lower than average crop this year. A couple producers have said they already have had to start feeding their bees this year but other than that the hives have been healthy.

Utah harvest is done for all producers and most of them say their hives have been looking healthy, but it was a little below average crop.

According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, in October Idaho had moderate to an area of severe drought along the southern border. Utah is currently under severe to extreme drought conditions with most of the state under extremely dry soil conditions. Colorado has an area of normal soil moisture through the center of the state with areas of moderate to severe drought in the eastern and western portions of the state.

Prices for the month of October were between \$2.60 and \$3.20 per pound with a mostly price of \$2.80-\$3.00 for Idaho, Colorado prices are too few producers reporting to determine a market. Prices for locally sourced honey in Utah are \$2.80-\$3.00 per pound with mostly \$2.80.

**ILLINOIS:** The weather has been good for October with seasonally average temperatures and lower than rainfall. Beekeepers continue to test for mites and those showing them present are being treated. Beekeepers report that there is no more wild foliage for their bees. Some beekeepers have finished feeding their bees, while others continue to feed them. Most beekeepers report that their bees are in good condition and are clustered for the winter. Demand for honey is good at the retail level and fairly good at the wholesale level. Prices are generally unchanged

**INDIANA:** The weather for October has been good with slightly less than average temperatures and below average rainfall. Beekeepers report their bees in good condition and prepared for winter. Some beekeepers continued supplemental feeding of their bees. Beekeepers with mite problems have begun treating their hives. Demand for honey is good and demand exceeded supply at the retail level and demand was fairly good at the wholesale level. Prices are generally unchanged.

**IOWA, KANSAS, MISSOURI, NEBRASKA:** No report issued.

**KENTUCKY:** October has been exceptionally dry and uncharacteristically chilly. In fact, on October 18, it snowed. It has not been cold enough to snow since the same date (Oct. 18) in 1989. These two climatic conditions have impacted winter stores for hives in Kentucky. Field inspections, show many hives are going into winter cluster without enough honey.

The two state beekeeper associations (Kentucky Queen Bee Breeders Association and Kentucky State Beekeepers Association) are planning for a joint Fall in-person meeting on Nov. 19th. Enthusiasm is building for 2023, and this event gives both association members a chance to be part of planning future events.

**LOUISIANA:** During the month of October temperatures were slightly below normal across most of the state. Precipitation was well below normal across the state once again. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, Louisiana had moderate drought conditions across most of the state.

Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

**MICHIGAN:** No report issued.

**MINNESOTA:** During the month of October temperatures were well above normal across the entire state. Precipitation for October was well below normal for the entire state.

According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, in October the northern part of the state had normal soil moisture. The central part of the state had abnormally dry soil conditions. The southern part of the state had moderate to severe drought conditions.

Producers are done harvesting this year and say they had an average harvest and things are looking better than they did last year with overall health and harvest.

Prices per pound in Minnesota were \$2.80-\$3.75 with mostly price of \$2.80-\$3.00 for locally sourced honey for the month of October.

**MISSISSIPPI:** Movement has been slow for this year while volume is average. Prices have gone up and that has beekeepers wondering if the slow business is because of the increase. A 30-40% loss has been reported before the winter months arrive. Light Amber reported at \$2.78 lb.

**MONTANA:** No report issued.

**NEW ENGLAND:** No report issued.

**NEW YORK:** Dry conditions continue over New York State. The first part of October brought cooler temperatures, but the later part of the month became warmer than normal, with delayed frosts and below normal precipitation. This exacerbates the reduced forage of late summer due to drought, stressing colonies. Beekeepers are spending more time monitoring hives and feeding. Reports of robbing by stronger hives from weaker hives, empty hives, and hives with evidence of Parasitic Mite Syndrome and Deformed Wing Virus. Below normal Fall honey harvest was reported. Honey demand remains strong.

**NORTH CAROLINA:** No report issued.

**NORTH & SOUTH DAKOTA:** Warmer weather continued. Topsoil and subsoil moisture, generally short to adequate all around, continued to decline throughout the month. Harvest advanced with some completed and many nearly so. Bees were prepared for their winter homes as growers began preparations for the upcoming winter.

**OHIO:** Western part of Ohio has not received rain during October and now is in a mild drought. Far eastern Ohio has received normal rain fall. Scattered showers occurred yesterday in western Ohio. Wright Patterson Air Force Base received .6 inches of very local rain at one of my three bee yards on the base near Huffman Prairie.

In Ohio 99% of nutrition resource flowers have finished blooming. Beekeepers are completing fall management of their honeybee colonies. Ohio has 51,000 colonies of honeybees which provide approximately 4 billion dollars' worth of pollination to Ohio Agriculture according to Jerry Hays, editor of Bee Culture Magazine. Three billion of the 4 billion is on 4.9 million acres of soybeans within Ohio.

The varroa mite is at its population peak now and must be controlled or the colony will be killed by viruses. High mite populations are in colonies, one example was 60 mites on 100 bees! Ohio locally adapted honeybees are controlling the populations of mites in their colonies. Through Natural Selection reproduction honeybees kill varroa. Through swarm trapping of feral honeybees in isolated remote areas in Ohio we can utilize mite biting honeybees. Honey wholesale is \$5.50 to \$6.50 per pound, retail is \$8.50 to \$10.50 per pound.

**OKLAHOMA:** During the month of October temperatures were above normal across most of the state. Precipitation was below normal across the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, there was severe to extreme drought conditions across most of the state. There was an area of exceptional drought along the Kansas border.

Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

**OREGON:** No report issued.

**SOUTH CAROLINA:** No report issued.

**TENNESSEE:** In Tennessee, October has been abnormally dry and cool. Some areas are still seeing goldenrod and aster nectar and pollen. Other areas of the state that have had hard freezes have seen no nectar or pollen flow. Honey container availability remains the main complaint about the supply chain.

**TEXAS:** During the month of October temperatures were slightly below normal across the state. Precipitation during October was again well below normal across the entire state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, soil moisture conditions for October showed soil moisture conditions from abnormally dry to severe drought conditions across most of the state with scattered areas of extreme to exceptional drought. The last days of the month were a blessing but still not that extended period that the entire state so desperately needs. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

**WASHINGTON:** Warm weather and drought conditions persisted well into October. Apple harvest continued in full swing as pear harvest was generally completed. Late season harvest of vegetables and fruit continued. Some smoke from wildfires persisted well into October in some areas. Later in the month, October weather showed up along with some cooler weather and precipitation. As the smoke dissipated light snow fell in higher mountains. Heavy rains fell West of the Cascades and lighter rain in the East. With no hard freezes fall harvest of apples and veg continued. Fall planting of over wintered crops was generally completed. Preparations were started for winter.

**WISCONSIN:** The weather for October has been good overall and there is a need for more rain. Treatment for mites has begun. The bees are in good condition as they go out on cleansing flights. Some foliage still remains, such as mint and some brassicas. Demand for honey is good at the retail level and fairly good at wholesale level. Prices are generally unchanged.
