COLONY, HONEY PLANT AND MARKET CONDITIONS DURING JULY 2023

APPALACHIAN DISTRICT (MD, PA, VA, WV): Colony health continues to be very good. Beekeepers were busy harvesting honey with volume reported as very good. The final weeks of July were very hot and humid with very high dew points and beekeepers reported increased bearding activity. Hives were adjusted to allow for airflow. Precipitation was isolated and often in the form of heavy downpours from passing thunderstorms. A few beekeepers were making splits. Bloom continued to be fairly good going into July, but the heat and humidity soon swept in and reduced the nectar and pollen flow as the Appalachian District heads into the dearth season. Pollen and nectar sources in July started with the end of sourwood bloom and continued with dandelion, white and red clovers, corn, alfalfa, black-eyed Susan, thistle, bee-balm, milkweed, tickseed, teasel, bergamot and various other wildflowers.

ALABAMA: In Alabama major nectar flowers slowed down by the beginning of July, with most beekeepers reporting that their honey crops were below average. Coupled to this was a consensus that many colonies contained lower worker populations than usual. Summer forbs, like rudbeckia, ratibida, eryngium, pycnanthemum, and vernonia were flowering; as was trumpet vine, mimosa, hibiscus, and crepe myrtle. Varroa levels were on the rise, with some beekeepers opting for a summer treatment post-honey extraction. Hive beetle populations also began to rise steadily, especially in colonies not fitted with appropriately sized woodenware. Several reports of queen loss came from northern regions. The extreme heat and humidity, especially during the latter half of the month, affected the ability of beekeepers to monitor and manage their colonies.

ARIZONA: No report issued

ARKANSAS: During the month of July temperatures were well above normal across most of the state. Precipitation was about normal across most of the same area. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, Arkansas had mostly normal soil moisture conditions existed across most of the state. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

CALIFORNIA: Despite heavy winter rains, forage didn't flourish as well for hives some California beekeepers had hoped for this July. "The odd weather affected bloom timing and production," one beekeeper said. "We did OK, but not as well as we hoped." Another beekeeper noted that his hives had finished making honey by mid-July in areas with wild sage, buckwheat and toyon. Some star thistle was also produced and offered forage.

"Many hives were moved back to the Central Valley for melon pollination and cotton/alfalfa honey production," he said. "Unfortunately, there are far fewer acres of both crops this year than in the past so not much 'valley honey' was produced in July."

Even more, Lygus insects were heavily affected cotton crops in most areas, which required frequent applications of pesticides. Though honey sales remained limited for July, markets seemed similar to the same time last year.

FLORIDA: Temperatures were slightly above average for most of the month with humidity above average on many days and precipitation about normal. Bee health was considered to be about average for July, which would be slightly below average in cooler months of the year. The Panhandle received a pretty good flow from various wildflowers, Spanish Needle, sumac and a little Golden Rod. The honey produced was sufficient to sustain most hives with some supplemental feeding needed in a few areas. Many beekeepers were splitting hives in this area. Cabbage palm and mangrove was available in many areas along both coasts and in South Florida. This honey and some wildflower honeys were the main commercial honey produced during the month. Beekeepers were also supplemental feeding in preparation for splitting hives before the Brazilian Pepper season is expected to begin. Some expected the Pepper season to start a little earlier, which would be late August or early September, this year due to accelerated maturity from more heat days. Brazilian Pepper honey production will be the next significant source of honey and should continue until around the middle of October. Tupelo honey production was a big disappointment with only very light amounts of honey produced this season. There were light supplies of wildflower, cabbage palm, and mangrove honey stored at the end of the month.

GEORGIA: The Tupelo crop has been reported to be average this year and the Sourwood is ready to get pulled soon. Commercial grade honey demand has increased as schools get back into play. The days were good and not so good in July. One day it will be nice and the bees are out and about and then there could be wind and some strong thunderstorms and rain to wash away all the fresh pollen and nectar. Then it will be good again for a week or so. The bees are reported to be in good condition as beekeepers kept an eye on them and treated the hives earlier to prevent any problems later. Prices remain strong and steady. \$6.50 lb for Sourwood bulk. \$2.50-3.60 lb for commercial grade

IDAHO, COLORADO, UTAH: During the month of July temperatures were a little higher than normal in Idaho. In Idaho precipitation was lower than normal. Utah had temperatures that were normal and precipitation that was below normal. Colorado had a little higher temperature than normal across the whole state. Precipitation for Colorado was normal for eastern Colorado and western Colorado.

According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, in July Idaho had no drought to an area of moderate drought in northern Idaho. Utah is currently under no drought to moderate drought conditions. Colorado had normal soil moisture to moderate drought in western Colorado.

Producers are saying in Idaho hives are doing well and the honey flow is good. Utah is saying they are having problems with the heat and the honey flow is slow so far.

Prices for the month of July were between \$2.80 and \$3.20 per pound with a mostly price of \$2.85-\$3.00 for Idaho, Colorado prices are too few producers reporting to determine a market. Prices for locally sourced honey in Utah are \$2.80-\$3.25 per pound with mostly \$3.25.

ILLINOIS: The weather for July was hot with less rain than usual. Beekeepers report that most of their bees are in fair to good condition. Beekeepers also report that there are very little wildflowers left for the bees. Beekeepers report good to very good production in the month of July. Demand for honey is good at the retail level and fairly good at wholesale level with wholesalers waiting to see where prices go. Prices are generally unchanged.

INDIANA: Temperatures for the month of July were normal and there was more rain than usual. Beekeepers report that their bees continue to feed on wildflowers, such as clover and alfalfa. The bees are said to be in fair to good condition. Beekeepers report a decent amount of honey flow. Demand for honey is good at the retail level and fairly good at the wholesale level. Prices are generally unchanged.

IOWA, KANSAS, MISSOURI, NEBRASKA: No report issued.

KENTUCKY: In Kentucky the beehives were in good condition, with a few isolated cases of European foulbrood. Honey harvest in line with the production seen the last few years. The pollen sources in July were typical mid-summer florals such as clovers, balm, purple cone-headed flowers, and grey cone-headed flowers.

LOUISIANA: During the month of July temperatures were well above normal across most of the state. Precipitation was well below normal across the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, the northern third of Louisiana had normal soil moisture. Central Louisiana was abnormally dry to moderately drought conditions. Southern parts of the state were under moderate to severe drought. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

MICHIGAN: No report issued.

MINNESOTA: During the month of July temperatures were normal across the whole state. Precipitation for July was below normal for the whole state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, in July the whole state had moderate dry to severe dry soil moisture.

Prices per pound in Minnesota were \$2.80-\$3.75 with mostly price of \$2.80-\$3.00 for locally sourced honey for the month of July.

MISSISSIPPI: The weather continued to keep the honey business on its knees. Earlier it was freezing temps and now excessive heat has kept the bees close to the hives and in need of water. Very little food available and what is out there the bees need for nutrition and there is not much left to take back to the hive. Very little honey produced this year and availability is unknown for the season.

MONTANA: No report issued.

NEW ENGLAND: No report issued.

NEW YORK: July brought warm, humid, wet conditions, which may have contributed to a bumper early summer nectar flow in most parts of the state. Previously on the drought map, Orange County experienced extreme flooding. Western NY and Long Island still have abnormally dry or moderate drought conditions. There were some reports of late season European foulbrood and sacbrood. Honey sales are strong, and many beekeepers are harvesting their summer honey for sales and to make room for more nectar gathering by the bees. The nectar flow is showing signs of the mid-summer slowdown, or dearth, but there are expectations for the late summer bloom of goldenrod, and Japanese Knotweed. Honey prices are increasing, with some beekeepers raising prices wholesale.

NORTH CAROLINA: No report issued.

NORTH & SOUTH DAKOTA: Warmer weather continued to aid plant development and most crops were near or ahead of last year and behind or near the average. Pastures, hay, and alfalfa were fair to good despite the warm weather. Bees taking advantage over various floral sources including sunflowers which began to bloom. By the end of the month first cuttings of alfalfa had been completed and growers were well into the second cuttings. Additional rain would help to ease drier conditions as temperatures rise.

OHIO: Adequate rain fall and warmer than usual. Nectar and pollen flows were above average depending on location. Sumac trees were in full bloom. Pollinator flowers such as Wing stem are starting to bloom about 10 days early. Prairies were in full bloom by third week in July. Soybeans started to bloom third week in July, nectar flows are heavy. Honeybee colonies were producing soybean honey which will continue for several weeks. Bean flowers start to secrete nectar approximately 9:30 AM and continue to produce nectar until about 6PM. If beekeepers have not provided proper colony management, the brood area of the colony is honey bound and the queen doesn't have the adequate area to lay eggs. Proper training is required to beekeepers to manage their bees' foraging force. Wheat was combined two weeks ago then soybeans were planted immediately, some fields are turning green already. Most beekeepers and farmers don't understand the relationship between beekeepers and soybean production. Bean production can increase by 15% if bean flowers are visited by pollinators.

Honeybee swarming has almost ended. Hundreds of houses in Ohio have feral colonies of honeybees within their walls. Homeowners are frightened with honeybees in their homes. Many Beekeepers are doing cutouts of the bee colonies. Honey prices \$5.50 to \$6.50 pound wholesale, \$9.00 to \$11.00 retail.

OKLAHOMA: During the month of July temperatures were about normal across most of the state. Precipitation was well above normal across the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, Oklahoma had scattered areas of normal soil moisture to areas of abnormally dry, to areas of moderate drought conditions. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

OREGON: No report issued.

SOUTH CAROLINA: Prices sold on the SC State Farmers Market in West Columbia were reported as: 12/1 - Pt \$70.00-75.00, 12/1- Qt \$110.00-130.00, 12 ct. Honey Bears -\$40.00-48.00, 4/1 Gallon - \$180.00 and 1-Gallon \$50.00.

TENNESSEE: Beekeepers are reporting very low honey production across the state of Tennessee for the year. Major pollen and nectar plants for July were Sourwood, Sumac and clover. No serious colony losses have been reported during July. Colonies appear to be healthy and strong. Local honey is in short supply across the state.

TEXAS: During the month of July temperatures were very much above normal across the state. When Texas has “record” highs across the entire state it is hot! It is not all a “dry heat”. Precipitation during July was well below normal across most of the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, soil moisture conditions for July had reverted to the very dry conditions across much of the state. Going from North to South, soil moisture was normal to abnormally dry conditions. Central and South Texas had abnormally dry to severe drought with the area of exceptional drought continuing West of the San Antonio area and growing. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

WASHINGTON: July started warm with dry conditions and no precipitation across the state. Central Washington was showing signs of drought. Cherry harvest continued along with apricots. Berries were coming in and peaches began mature. Apple thinning was completed, and pears sizing nicely. Vegetables were being harvested including early sweet corn. Growers were cutting peppermint, while hops were filling in the trellis. By mid-July brush fires had started throughout Yakima county, with some fires shutting down interstate highways. Growers started peach harvest. There were late-maturing sweet cherries that passed through the packing houses. Pear growers moved bins into orchards to prepare for the Bartlett harvest. In East and Central Washington, producers were gearing up for harvest. Apple growers utilized several strategies to protect fruit from excessive temperatures and sunburn, including evaporative misting, net screening, kaolin clay, and other crop protectants. As the month went on dry conditions prevailed as growers prepped for Bartlett and early apple harvests. Floral sources were limited and most of the wildflowers were short-lived due to heat and drought.

WISCONSIN: Temperatures for the month of July were high. There was a lot less rain than usual. There has been no problem with insects. Generally, bees are in fair to good condition. Foliage for the bees includes Catnip, mint, fennel, parsley, queen Anne’s lace, poppy, squash, cucumbers, beans, tomatoes, onions and raspberries. Production was good for some. Others had little to no production. Demand for honey is good at the retail level and fairly good at the wholesale level. Prices are generally unchanged.
