COLONY, HONEY PLANT AND MARKET CONDITIONS DURING AUGUST 2023

APPALACHIAN DISTRICT (MD, PA, VA, WV): August was basically hot and dry the entire month with a few scattered and infrequent rainfalls that passed through the Appalachian District. Colonies are doing fairly well. Beekeepers finished extracting honey at the start of the month for wholesale and retail sales and honey show entries for various fairs and local beekeeping events. A few beekeepers did start to feed colonies to encourage production of fall and winter honey stores. During the August dearth, which is more severe in some areas as opposed to others that received rainfall, bees foraged on mostly red and white clovers, thistles, goldenrod, joe-pye weed, boneset, milkweed, mountain mint, buckwheat, and various other wildflowers. Several beekeepers started mite treatments near the latter part of the month.

ALABAMA: In Alabama the southern portion of the state experienced unseasonably warm conditions throughout August that eventually lead to drought-like conditions in the southwest; northern parts of the state saw unusually warm conditions during mid to late August only. As a result, many beekeepers reported that their queens briefly shutting down due to poor forage and high temperatures, resulting in a period of low brood. The warmer temperatures also reportedly resulted in fewer inspections by beekeepers as they looked to avoid heat stress. Some beekeepers took advantage of low brood in colonies to treat for varroa; small hive beetle management was ongoing. Cotton and corn provided some agricultural-sourced forage for bees, as did goldenrod, boneset, rudbeckia, and helianthus, especially during the latter part of the month in the more northern regions. Kudzu represented a large source of food for bees in coastal areas.

ARIZONA: Though monsoons provided moisture sporadically, drought conditions persisted through most of August in Arizona. As of August 29, the U.S. Drought Monitor showed that abnormally dry conditions covered 51 percent of the state, limiting nectar and pollen sources for the state's bees. In some areas with higher elevation, nighttime low temperatures fell as low as 50 degrees, which further stunted growth of forage. High temperatures ranged from the mid- to high 70s in mountainous regions to over 100 throughout the southern and western regions of the state.

Later in the month, the largest portion of the Arizona's pastures and ranges were reported to be in poor condition, with only 16 percent of the state's acreage being rated in good to excellent condition.

Scattered rains and measurable rainfall were reported in the northern part of the Arizona; however, the precipitation received was not enough to significantly improve soil moisture or range conditions. Farmers continued to harvest sweet corn, and feed corn was still in the pollination stage.

ARKANSAS: During the month of August temperatures were well above normal across most of the state. Precipitation was below normal across most of the same area. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, Arkansas had mostly normal soil moisture conditions across most of the state with a small area of abnormally dry to moderate drought in Eastern Arkansas. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

CALIFORNIA: Extreme heat that lingered from late July continued to affect California bees well into August, with temperatures reaching as high as 118 degrees in some areas. "The strange weather threw off the timing of many plants," one beekeeper said, "and the hot weather is tough on our colonies."

Though honey crops surpassed last year's production, volumes still fell short expectations for many beekeepers. "August in the Central Valley was OK for the bees, but there was not as much honey produced as in the past," another beekeeper noted. "Cotton is the principal source of honey every summer in the Central Valley, and cotton acreage is at a historic low. Pesticide applications to cotton and other crops have taken their toll on some hives."

Still, some buyers are reluctant to pay higher prices for honey. "We have not had any serious offers on new crop honey as some buyers are trying to pay less than what is reasonable for water white and extra white honey," a beekeeper said. "We will just hold on to what we have for now. Our local clientele do not mind the higher price we are asking."

August's extreme heat caused some forage plants to shut down. But by late in the month, bluecurl and tarweed began to bloom, which provided nectar and pollen for the bees. Melon pollination continued, but the number of hives in pollination declined seasonally by the end of the month. Some beekeepers hope rainfall from Tropical Storm Hilary that grazed the area could help plants that survived the heat to flourish ahead. For now, beekeepers have begun feeding colonies to prepare them for February's almond pollination efforts. "Many queens quit laying and are now recovering. The brood area was vastly reduced, but the bees kept bringing in pollen, which did not help in keeping the brood nest open," a beekeeper said. "We needed to treat for varroa mites, but the heat has delayed that also. We have moved most of the affected colonies to better pasture. We hope that cooler temps and the rainfall will help."

FLORIDA: Temperatures and humidity levels were slightly higher than normal for most of the month. They combined to make heat indexes that ranged on some days from 112 to over 120. Precipitation for the month was about average. Bee health was considered to be about average or slightly below average. There were few natural sources of nutrition for the bees leading to supplemental feeding for most of the month around the state. Many beekeepers believed the heat stress was causing plants to produce less nectar than normal. South Florida did have some cabbage palm and there were scattered wildflowers in some areas of the state. Brazilian Pepper began light bloom in parts of south Florida near the end of the month and is expected to be widely available across the state by the middle of September. Most beekeepers finished hive splitting in August with some treating for mites during the month. There was practically no honey produced for commercial purposes during the month. Light quantities of primarily gallberry or palmetto honey were stored at the end of the month. Due to limited quantities, prices appeared to be a little higher on stored honey. Hurricane Idalia made landfall in the bend of Florida on August 31 but appears to have affected honey production very slightly. A few reports of flooded hives have been received but not many hives are believed to have been located in the storm's path. More information should be available by next month.

GEORGIA: Some beekeepers report that the cotton in some areas did not produce as much honey as hoped for. The areas that were on dryland and not irrigated were the lowest produced areas due to lack of rain this season. In other areas in Central Georgia the results are reported to be a little better with more rain but no damages from hurricane Idalia. The southern areas of the state along the coast were hit the hardest by the storm. The September pull looks good for the start of the Fall harvesting with the Goldenrod coming along nicely even though it is late arriving. Beekeepers are keeping watch for a new wasp that may be detrimental to the industry if it manages to reproduce that was found in Savannah recently. More information will be available if there are more found and where they may be hiding.

IDAHO, COLORADO, UTAH: During the month of August temperatures were normal in Idaho. In Idaho precipitation was higher than normal. Utah had temperatures that were normal and precipitation that was above normal. Colorado had normal temperatures across the whole state, Precipitation for Colorado was about normal for eastern Colorado and western Colorado.

According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, in August Idaho had no drought to an area of moderate drought in northern Idaho. Utah is currently under no drought to moderate drought conditions. Colorado had normal soil moisture to moderate drought in western Colorado.

Prices for the month of August were between \$2.80 and \$3.20 per pound with a mostly price of \$2.85-\$3.00 for Idaho, Colorado prices are too few producers reporting to determine a market. Prices for locally sourced honey in Utah are \$2.80-\$3.25 per pound with mostly \$3.25.

ILLINOIS: Temperatures for the month of August were normal with very little rainfall. Beekeepers continue extracting honey from their hives and check for mites. Most beekeepers report that their bees are in good to excellent condition as they swarm and produce other hives as well as continuous cleansing flights. Beekeepers also report lots of foliage for their bees to feed on, such as goldenrod and aster, as they bring nectar back to the hives. Beekeepers report a good amount of production. Demand for honey is good at the retail level and fairly good at wholesale level. Prices are generally unchanged.

INDIANA: Temperatures for the month of August were normal for the state with a lack of rain in most parts of the state. Beekeepers report that their bees continue to feed on foliage, such as alfalfa. Beekeepers report their bees in good condition as they swarm for cleansing flights as well as starting other hives. Beekeepers report no problems with insects. A few beekeepers said they started poorly, but that production has increase appreciably. Demand for honey is good and that sales are up at the retail level and fairly good at the wholesale level. Prices are generally unchanged.

IOWA, KANSAS, MISSOURI, NEBRASKA: No report issued.

KENTUCKY: Many Kentucky beekeepers had their honey harvest ready for the Kentucky State Fair, with 36 different vendors, most of whom belonging to the Certified Kentucky Honey Program. Since the beekeepers receive 70% of the sales, over \$55K will be returned to the beekeepers as a result of this one event for the Kentucky State Beekeepers Association.

Beekeepers were also treating their hives, blessed with some unexpectedly cool weather at the beginning of the month. Then, the summer heat wave arrived, bringing with it the small hive beetles, and so beekeepers had to monitor that pest. The remainder of the month stayed hot and dry, and so some beekeepers are having to monitor honey stores.

LOUISIANA: During the month of August temperatures were well above normal across most of the state. Precipitation was well below normal across the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, most of the state is experiencing extreme to exceptional drought. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

MICHIGAN: No report issued.

MINNESOTA: During the month of August temperatures were normal across the whole state. Precipitation for August was below normal for the whole state.

According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, in August the whole state had moderate dry to severe dry soil moisture. Prices per pound in Minnesota were \$2.80-\$3.75 with mostly price of \$2.80-\$3.00 for locally sourced honey for the month of August.

MISSISSIPPI: Not a lot of honey produced this year in many areas of the Southeastern regions. It has been too dry for the wildflowers and goldenrod to generate blooms and the bees stayed close to the hives. Beekeepers are contemplating that they may have to start supplemental feeding if it continues into September. Reports of volume coming out of the hives is between 20-40 pounds while the norm is 85-100 pounds of honey collected. Many beekeepers are not building new hives as inflation and loss of production is not feasible to do so especially at this time

MONTANA: No report issued.

NEW ENGLAND: No report issued.

NEW YORK: August weather was generally warmer and wetter than normal in New York State. Top and subsoil moisture throughout the state is more than adequate, except for the Wyoming County area. Beekeepers are looking forward to a good Goldenrod, Purple Loosestrife, Japanese Knotweed honey crop, as the summer heat increases for September. Many beekeepers are already harvesting and extracting honey. Colony management includes varroa mite treatment, assessing colonies, and combining colonies, although signs of viral infection, and queen loss may be evident in some hives. Honey demand is very good with an upward trend in prices.

NORTH CAROLINA: No report issued.

NORTH & SOUTH DAKOTA: Most crops generally progressed at rates near last year or the average. Warm weather though water was generally short to adequate, mostly adequate. The second cutting of alfalfa moved ahead steadily from 40-50% complete early in August to 80-90% by the end of the month. Bees taking advantage over various floral sources including sunflowers continued blooming well into the middle of August. Additional rain would help to ease drier conditions in some areas.

OHIO: Northwest Ohio: Summer has been good for the bees and honey. Most people have excess honey this year. A dry May and June led to slightly above average moisture in July and August for most areas and that led to extended clover and summer flower bloom. Soybeans bloomed a couple of weeks late due to the early summer drought. The summer dearth has been minimal. Mite load seems to be higher than years past. Honey prices have remained stable at \$5.50-\$6.00 per pound wholesale and \$9.00-\$11.00 retail.

Central Ohio, Southwest Ohio, and Wright Patterson Air Force Base: The area has received adequate rain fall so far this month helping pollinator flowers and soybeans to produce nectar and pollen for honeybees plus the native bees. The mite populations are very low plus the mites that are on the screen bottom boards slides are all chewed. We notice the bees through Natural Selection and High Recombination Rates have the mites at very low populations and getting lower each generation. Bees at WPAFB had no Deformed Wing Virus, which is rare in general beekeeping.

OKLAHOMA: During the month of August temperatures were well above normal across most of the state. Precipitation was well below normal across the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, Oklahoma had scattered areas of normal soil moisture to areas of abnormally dry, to areas of moderate drought conditions. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

OREGON: No report issued.

SOUTH CAROLINA: Prices for South Carolina honey sold at the State Farmers Market in West Columbia, SC reported: 12/1 Pint \$70.00-75.00, 12/1 Quart \$110.00-130.00, 12 count. Honey Bears \$40.00-48.00, 4/1 Gallon \$180.00 and 1 Gallon \$50.00.

TENNESSEE: In Tennessee, August was hot and dry for most of the state. A few beekeepers reported a decent harvest of Sourwood honey from colonies in the mountains. Overall, the harvest is down from previous years. The sourwood and sumac continued to bloom into August. The only other nectar and pollen sources reported were goldenrod, asters and other wildflowers.

TEXAS: During the month of August temperatures were very much above normal across the state. Another month of record highs across the entire state. It is still hot! Precipitation during August was well below normal across most of the state again. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, soil moisture conditions for August continued the very dry conditions across much of the state. Most of the state is now experiencing moderate to exceptional drought. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

WASHINGTON: August was generally warm and dry, even more so by the end of the month. Dry land crops showed sign of stress. Cherry harvest wound down towards the end of the month while peach and nectarine harvest continued. Pear and apple harvest began to get underway. Vegetables continued to fill farm stands and gardens. By the end of the month a few hops were ready. As the month went on dry, drought conditions continued to affect most areas, especially those with little or no irrigation. Floral sources were limited to the mountain and higher elevations.

WISCONSIN: Temperatures for the month of August were slightly warmer for the state of Wisconsin with less than normal rainfall, according to a few of the beekeepers for the state, but report very satisfactory health of their hives. Beekeepers also report a good honey flow. Beekeepers report more than enough wild foliage for their bees and noticed that this particular year and season their bees are feeding on goldenrod and other miscellaneous flowers. Demand for honey is good at the retail level and fairly good at the wholesale level. Prices are generally unchanged.
