COLONY, HONEY PLANT AND MARKET CONDITIONS DURING SEPTEMBER 2023

APPALACHIAN DISTRICT (MD, PA, VA, WV): Colonies were doing very well and beekeepers were actively preparing colonies with mite treatments for the upcoming winter months. Some beekeepers set out supplemental food although there are small pockets of nectar and pollen sources in the form of goldenrod, ragweed, milkweed, clovers, and various other wildflowers throughout the district. September temperatures were seasonable for the most part interrupted by several days of rain. Some of that moisture was from the remnants of two hurricanes that passed through.

ALABAMA: Alabama experienced typical ambient temperature, but reduced precipitation, for the month of September. This resulted in increasingly dry conditions as the month progressed, with counties in the southwest part of the state experiencing drought-like conditions. This no doubt had some impact on honeybee forage. For example, goldenrod, the main nectar and pollen source for honeybees during fall, appeared somewhat later than usual in most areas of the state. In central Alabama, substantial goldenrod blooms were not noticeable until the very end of September. During September, most beekeepers were particularly vigilant for varroa and food levels in their colonies, and they took appropriate actions like miticide applications or sugar water feeding, if necessary.

ARIZONA: No report issued.

ARKANSAS: During the month of September temperatures were well above normal across most of the state. Precipitation was well below normal across most of the same area. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, Arkansas had mostly normal soil moisture conditions across most of the state with a few areas of severe drought scattered across Eastern Arkansas. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

CALIFORNIA: California beekeepers have reported relatively normal conditions for September, with hives rebuilding and bees producing honey both from wildflowers and commercial crops. “The big question for everyone is the demand and supply for almond pollination,” a beekeeper said of the winter ahead.

Bees were able to harvest honey from tarweed, blue curl, rosin weed, sticker weed as well as late-blooming cotton in September. They were also used for melon pollination.

Many bees were placed for September in the Sierra foothills for wildflower forage. “Most colonies responded well to the late honey flows, and we were able to get some surplus honey to extract,” a beekeeper said. “The colonies that were subjected to the extreme summer heat finally began rebuilding. We are currently treating for mites as the weather has cooled enough to be able to use formic acid. Our earlier treatments with Apivar were somewhat disappointing, so we had to treat again.”

FLORIDA: After an extremely hot and humid August, temperatures and precipitation returned to about average for September. Bee health was considered to be about average with some mite treatments primarily in Central Florida. Hurricane Ian devastated the Brazilian Pepper crop in the state last year and it appears the crop has been delayed this year in most of the state. South Florida Brazilian Pepper production, which was very light last year, has rebounded some this year but still appears to be a little less than normal. Most Central Florida beekeepers who were delaying mite treatments until after the Pepper season were still waiting for the season to begin at the end of the month. Pepper honey production was still very light at the end of the month in Central areas. Bloom appears to have been pushed back at least a week or two later than normal this year in this area. Whether this was caused by the August heat, last year’s hurricane or a combination of several other factors is currently unknown. Most beekeepers are still hoping for reasonable honey production from one of Florida’s most important honey sources, but just a little later than usual. North Florida had practically no Pepper honey

production at the end of the month. The Panhandle area was the bright spot for honey production in September. Goldenrod, Spanish Needle and other assorted wildflower honey production appeared to be very good during the month. Prices also appeared to be a little higher for this honey as honey production overall for the state of Florida was low for the month. Flooding damage to hives from Hurricane Idalia in late August appears to have been very light and primarily centered around the Tampa area.

GEORGIA: The movement has increased and is moving a little better now. Producers are running labs to check for pesticides and other things to make sure the honey is of good quality. Color is reported to be good, not too dark and most is of medium amber. Honey from the cotton fields is bringing \$2.60-2.70 a pound depending upon the moisture content. The Tupelo and Sourwood is light in volume and running \$6.50 lb for Tupelo and \$7.00 lb for Sourwood in the barrels.

IDAHO, COLORADO, UTAH: During the month of September temperatures were normal in Idaho. In East Idaho precipitation was higher than normal, Western Idaho precipitation was average. Utah had temperatures that were normal and precipitation that was normal. Colorado had normal temperatures across the whole state, Precipitation for Colorado was far below normal for Colorado.

According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, in September Idaho had no drought to an area of moderate drought in Northern Idaho. Utah is currently under no drought to abnormally drought conditions. Colorado had normal soil moisture to moderate drought in western Colorado. Prices for the month of September were between \$2.80 and \$3.20 per pound with a mostly price of \$3.00 for Idaho, Colorado prices are too few producers reporting to determine a market. Prices for locally sourced honey in Utah are \$3.00-\$3.25 per pound with mostly \$3.20.

ILLINOIS: Temperatures for the month of September were higher than normal with a lack of rainfall. Beekeepers are checking for mites. Most beekeepers report that their bees are in good to excellent condition. Beekeepers also report a little bit of foliage for their bees to feed on, such as goldenrod and aster. A few beekeepers are giving sugar water to their bees. Beekeepers say there has been a good amount of production in September. Demand for honey is good at the retail level and fairly good at wholesale level. Prices are generally unchanged.

INDIANA: Temperatures for the month of September were warmer with a few days in the 90s. Rainfall in most parts of the state was well below average for this time of the year. Beekeepers report that their bees continue to feed on foliage, such as alfalfa, clover and goldenrod, and have pollen, but no nectar. Beekeepers report their bees in good condition and that they have a healthy population. Beekeepers report low mite counts and have begun treatment with oxalic acid. Beekeepers have started supplemental feeding of the bees. A few beekeepers report that they have had no production in September and therefore no sales in September. Prices are generally unchanged.

IOWA, KANSAS, MISSOURI, NEBRASKA: No report issued.

KENTUCKY: The month of September brought hot, dry conditions for Kentucky beekeepers. Many beekeepers found that their colonies had consumed some of the honey stores, but by the last week of September, with a well-timed rain, the bees were bringing in nectar and pollen again. Goldenrod, ironweed, New England asters, and smartweed were providing both nectar and pollen. In some of the samples taken for the USDA Honeybee Health Survey, one was able to see varroa-mite related damages, such as parasitic mite syndrome and deformed wing virus. The E-z mite samples also showed that hives in some regions were higher than USDA-recommended varroa mite populations should be, especially for September. Small hive beetles were more present in the Region 2 area compared to the other three regions; no surprise given the hot temperatures of September.

LOUISIANA: During the month of September temperatures were above normal across most of the state. Precipitation was well below normal across the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, most of the state is experiencing exceptional drought. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

MICHIGAN: No report issued.

MINNESOTA: During the month of September temperatures were normal across the whole state. Precipitation for September was far above normal for the whole state.

According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, in September the whole state had moderate dry to severe dry soil moisture, with a couple spots of extreme drought. Prices per pound in Minnesota were \$2.80-\$3.00 with mostly price of \$2.80-\$3.00 for locally sourced honey for the month of September.

MISSISSIPPI: The volume of honey is light and most that is available is from the Spring. Beekeepers are reporting loss of trees from being too dry and leaves falling off creating a difficult situation for the bees to produce any honey. Production is reported to be half of what is usually expected. Price for wildflower \$2.85 lb.

MONTANA: No report issued.

NEW ENGLAND: No report issued.

NEW YORK: September continued a trend of warmer, humid conditions, soil moisture adequate, promoting a good Fall honey flow. The exception is for parts of western New York where there was a shorter fall nectar flow, with abnormally dry and early drought conditions. The end of the month had a warmer dry spell statewide. Beekeepers are finishing up the honey harvest for the year and applying varroa mite treatments in preparation for winter. Few reports of disease and small hive beetle, with most hives generally reported healthy. This may change when mite numbers peak in October. Honey demand and prices are up for the Fall harvest season and pre-holiday sales.

NORTH CAROLINA: No report issued.

NORTH & SOUTH DAKOTA: Harvest for most crops progressed at rates near last year or the average. Water supplies were generally short to adequate, mostly adequate. Growers concentrated on harvest and in beginning the preparations for fall and winter.

OHIO: September has been a dry month, received less than one inch in most of Ohio. In the last three days, Southwest Ohio we received about .5 inch. Depending on the location, soil type, underground river between Lake Erie and Ohio River, local pollinator flowers were producing plenty of nectar and pollen. Other areas of Ohio, not much. Golden Rod and the asters have started to bloom and will bloom most of October. There has been an increase in landowners planting pollinator flowers this year. Monarch butterflies are migrating through Ohio beginning. With our work at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, we had 800 acres of pollinators flowers that started to bloom in early July. The monarchs are stopping at the Base for nectar. Varroa mite populations are higher than usual in commercial honeybees this fall, so chemicals are being applied. Feral honeybee colonies have varroa under control. Many beekeepers are feeding their bees in areas of drought. Honey prices remain stable, wholesale \$5.50 - \$6.00 per pound, retail \$9.00 - \$11.00 per pound. The feral bee population is very healthy at WPAFB. With the peat soil plus high-water table, the flowers are providing good nutrition to honeybees. Other native bees such as bumblebees are very plentiful and expected to have well over 200 plus different native bees at WPAFB.

September was dry and unseasonably warm, especially the first half. Goldenrod has mostly finished blooming in northern Ohio and aster has been blooming gloriously. Thanks to some rain at the end of the month, the last of the boneset species and later flowering goldenrod is once again producing nectar.

In Columbus, Cincinnati and Toledo the warmest temperatures occurred in the first week of September, peaking at 92 degrees F in Columbus and 93 degrees in both Cincinnati and Toledo. On the 19th, temperatures dropped to the lowest point in the lower 40's. Youngstown dropped to 39 degrees September 19. Rainfall was below normal throughout Ohio, for example Columbus received only .77" with a normal rainfall of 2.95", while Cincinnati was 1.96" below normal and Toledo was 2" below average.

OKLAHOMA: During the month of September temperatures were well above normal across most of the state. Precipitation was below normal across the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, Oklahoma had normal soil moisture in the northern part of the state gradually getting drier as you move to the South. There are areas of extreme drought along the Texas border. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

OREGON: No report issued.

SOUTH CAROLINA: In the Midlands area only a few beekeepers reported low incidence of mites, with few sources of forage besides wildflowers and goldenrod. Prices for South Carolina honey sold at the State Farmers Market in West Columbia, SC reported: 12/1 Pint \$70.00-75.00, 12/1 Quart \$110.00-130.00, 12 count. Honey Bears \$40.00-48.00, 4/1 Gallon \$180.00 and 1 Gallon \$50.00.

TENNESSEE: Tennessee did not have a good nectar flow in September. Goldenrod and Asters were the primary nectar and pollen sources but there was not enough rain to provide a good nectar flow. Honeybee colonies appear to be healthy across the state with no significant pest or disease issues reported in September. Retail honey sales are being reported from \$15 to \$30 per pound across the state.

TEXAS: During the month of September temperatures were very much above normal across the state. Another month of record highs across the entire state. The month ended hot! Precipitation during September was slightly below normal to well below normal across most of the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, soil moisture conditions for September showed a few small areas of normal soil moisture. The majority of the state still has mostly moderate drought to exceptional drought conditions. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.

WASHINGTON: While western Washington was generally dry, central Washington received some rain early in the month. The harvest continued with Bartlett pears and early maturing apple varieties like Gala and Honeycrisp. As berry harvests were completed, the vegetable harvest continued while the hop harvest got underway more seriously. The weather was generally drier. Temperatures were generally moderate. Later in the month precipitation began to pick up again seriously. Growers continued harvest and began preparations for fall and winter.

WISCONSIN: Temperatures for the month of September were warmer than usual and rainfall was less than normal for the state of Wisconsin, according to a few of the beekeepers. They have begun combating mites with miticidal strips and oxalic acid. They report a normal, healthy population of bees. Beekeepers report very little wild foliage for their bees and aster is the only flower remaining. They have begun supplemental feeding of the bees. No production reported and sales are based on honey harvested in August. Demand for honey is good at the retail level and fairly good at the wholesale level. Prices are generally unchanged.
