Methodology: Total Receipts Report

Data Source: Total Receipts reports are created using information on the handling of milk obtained from Federal Milk Marketing Order personnel.

Receipts of Producer Milk by Regulated Handlers is the amount of producer milk in pounds that qualifies for pooling on each of the Federal Milk Marketing Orders each month. Each order has its own criteria that determines if a producer's milk is eligible to be pooled. Handlers must comply with these standards or the producer's milk is not eligible to be pooled on the Federal Milk Marketing Order. Regulated handlers, under certain circumstances and price relationships, may elect to not include certain quantities of producer milk that is eligible to be pooled on Federal Milk Marketing Orders. The All Markets Combined is the total of all the producer milk pooled for the month. The year-to-date and annual amount of receipts is the total of the monthly amounts.

Average Daily Delivery of Milk Per Producer to Regulated Handlers is the amount of producer milk pooled under each Federal Milk Marketing Order divided by the number of producers whose milk is pooled for that month for each Order and then divided by the number of days in the month. The All Markets Combined is the monthly total of milk pooled divided by the total number of producers whose milk is pooled for the month and then divided by the days in the month. The year-to-date is the simple average of the monthly data that is available at the time of publication. Once all monthly data becomes available at the end of each year the year-to-date amount is the annual simple average for all months for each Federal Milk Marketing Order.

Butterfat Test of Producer Milk is the average percentage of butterfat contained in the producer milk pooled each month. Since all Federal Milk Marketing Orders utilize butterfat content in their milk pricing, all Federal Milk Marketing Orders are listed. The All Markets Combined is the weighted average percentage of butterfat contained in all of the orders combined, weighted by the amount of butterfat in each order. The year-to-date average is the weighted average butterfat test percentage for all available months. Once all monthly data becomes available at the end of each year, the year-to-date amount is the annual weighted average for all months for each and all Federal Milk Marketing Order(s).

Nonfat Solids Test of Producer Milk is the average percentage of nonfat solids (all milk solids other than butterfat) contained in the producer milk pooled each month. Data is only reported for those Federal Milk Marketing Orders that utilize multiple component pricing. *Multiple component pricing is used in the Northeast (Order 1), Upper Midwest (Order 30), Central (Order 32), Mideast (Order 33), California (51), Pacific Northwest (Order 124), and Southwest (Order 126) Orders.* The All Markets Combined is the weighted average percentage of nonfat solids contained in all of the component orders combined. The year-to-date is the weighted average nonfat solids test percentage for all available months. Once all monthly data becomes available at the end of each year, the year-to-date amount is the annual weighted average for all months for each and all Federal Milk Marketing Order(s).

Protein (True) Test of Producer Milk is the average percentage of protein (true) contained in the producer milk pooled each month. Data is only reported for those Federal Milk Marketing Orders that utilize multiple component pricing. *Multiple component pricing is used in the Northeast (Order 1), Upper Midwest (Order 30), Central (Order 32), Mideast (Order 33), California (Order 51), Pacific Northwest (Order 124), and Southwest (Order 126) Orders.* The All Markets Combined is the weighted average percentage of protein (true) contained in all of the component orders combined. The year-to-date is the weighted average protein (true) test percentage for all available months. Once all monthly data becomes available at the end of each year, the year-to-date amount is the annual weighted average for all months for each and all Federal Milk Marketing Order(s).

Other Solids Test of Producer Milk is the average percentage of other solids (other than butterfat and protein (true)). Data is only reported for those Federal Milk Marketing Orders that utilize multiple component pricing. *Multiple component pricing is used in the Northeast (Order 1), Upper Midwest (Order 30), Central (Order 32), Mideast (Order 33), California (Order 51), Pacific Northwest (Order 124), and Southwest (Order 126) Orders.* The All Markets Combined is the weighted average percentage of other solids contained in all of the component orders combined. The year-to-date is the weighted average other solids test percentage for all available months. Once all monthly data becomes available at the end of each year, the year-to-date amount is the annual weighted average for all months for each and all Federal Milk Marketing Order(s).

Somatic Cell Count of Producer Milk is the average number of somatic cells per milliliter contained in the producer milk reported for those orders who utilize somatic cell counts in their milk pricing formulas. *Somatic cell counts are used in the pricing of producer milk in the Upper Midwest (Order 30), Central (Order 32), Mideast (Order 33), California (Order 51), and Southwest (Order 126) Orders.* The All Markets Combined is the weighted average somatic cell count of the orders that utilize this count. The year-to-date is the weighted average somatic cell count for all available months. Once all monthly data becomes available at the end of each year, the year-to-date amount is the annual weighted average for all months for each and all Federal Milk Marketing Order(s).

Reliability: The AMS audit staff periodically perform on-site audits on the amounts of producer milk pooled to ensure accurate reporting of pool, milk components, and other milk price information.


